Mass Intentions refer to the practice of offering a Mass for a specific purpose, such as for living or deceased individuals. The "†" means that a person is deceased. The "(Sp)" means that it is a Special Intention for someone in need or an event like a birthday. The practice allows us to pray for others, both the living and the dead. This is a meaningful way for Catholics to express their faith and support for others through prayer. Asuggested donation in the province of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, which the Diocese of Sacramento is part, is \$10.00 but if a person cannot afford it there is no need for a donation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

September 28, 2025 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 16:19-31

I am embarrassed to admit that I

frequently find myself dining and

socializing with people who have millions and sometimes billions of

dollars. I've eaten more caviar, lobster and wagyu steak than most people on the planet. I justify it by saying it's part of my job. But I have seven pairs of nice jeans and expensive shoes. So, it is rather uncomfortable to hear Our Lord say: "My child, remember that you received what was good in your lifetime, while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented" (Luke 16:25). Fellow rich people (and if you're American, you're rich), do we not vehemently though quietly object to this parable's karmaesque reward system? Why bless the rich man just to curse him later? And

curse Lazarus just to bless him later?

So, Americans go to hell, while

Burundians and Afghans go to

heaven? What is going on? One clue is that the condemned rich man doesn't complain of injustice. Rather, he simply begs to help his brothers to repent. Of what? We don't know exactly. Perhaps another clue is that the rich man now seems more like the downtrodden Lazarus. He knows what it is to be hungry and thirsty, to be wounded in the gutter; that he deserved that, not fancy meals and clothes. Maybe the rich man finally understands how to receive true blessings, but it is too late for him. But not for me. Not for us. - John Muir @I Pi


PASTORAL COUNCIL

TWO TYPES OF PRIESTS

There are 2 types of Catholic Priests, Diocesan Priests and Religious Priests. Diocesan priests serve in

parishes/schools assigned to them in a specific diocese by their local bishop. They take a vow of chastity and obedience but not a vow of poverty. They are allowed to own property and a vehicle and live independently.

Religious Priests choose a religious community or an order, based on charism, lifestyle, and mission. They take a vow of poverty alongside their vows of chastity and obedience and only "own" things communally. Some examples of the many religious orders are Dominican, Jesuit, and Carmelite.




LIVING THE WORD SCRIPTURE STUDY

HOW DO YOU BECOME A PRIEST

Question: If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer: Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.



TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE FOR CAMP RECREATION




