
LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Profession of Faith (Nicene Creed). (Please stand.) I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.


Act of Spiritual Communion
