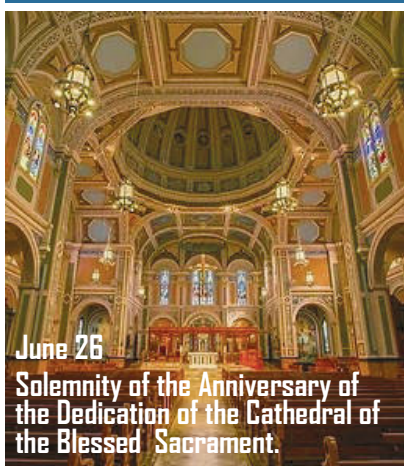

GOSPEL MEDITATION

June 26, 2022

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion. There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry.

Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't. Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.

REFLECTIONS

Vicar General and Chancellor

Question:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

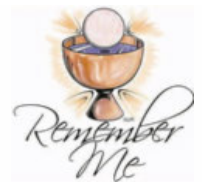

From the Vocations Committee....

Did you know we are blessed to have two seminarians staying with Father Eduino in the Rectory until the end of August? Benjamin Condon and Ivan Franco have a full schedule this summer while completing Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) so that they can serve as Chaplains in the hospitals. Here are some introductory words from them.



"To introduce myself, my name is Benjamin Condon, I am a seminarian for this Diocese of Sacramento, and I have just begun my 'pastoral year' which is a part of the last third of my time in seminary. I am from St Mel's Parish and when I was in high school, I felt a call to the priesthood. This was during a Eucharistic retreat called Pan de Vida put on by the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal and the Office of Vocations for the Diocese of Sacramento and from that I spent the next two years discerning with the priest in the parish trying to understand this call. Finally, after graduating high school and getting great help from different priests, I applied to the Diocese and entered Mt. Angel Seminary in Oregon to begin my studies. This summer I am assigned to complete a hospital chaplaincy program at UC Davis Hospital and Fr. Eduino Silveira has graciously allowed me to stay at Our Lady of the Assumption for the duration of the program. There is lots more to my story that I would love to share and there are lots of people here I'm excited to meet. May God bless you always."

"My name is Ivan Franco. I was born in Chico, California and raised in a small town near Chico, called Willows. My home parish is St. Monica's Catholic Church and I also consider Sacred Heart in Maxwell Ca as an important parish. I grew up attending both St. Monica's and Sacred Heart parishes.



After graduating from Willows High School, I began working at a casino as a security guard and some years later I transferred to the Accounting department for an entry level position. My discernment to the priesthood began a year later, however as a child I always felt attracted to the priesthood. As I grew, the thoughts of priesthood would come and go. I finally entered Catholic seminary in August of 2014 at Mount Angel in St. Benedict, Oregon. After completing my fourth of philosophy seminary, I started theological studies at St. Patrick's Seminary located in Menlo Park. I am currently doing CPE training and after that I will begin my pastoral year. Thank you and God bless."

If you see Benjamin or Ivan, please seize the opportunity to introduce yourselves and say, "Welcome and thank you for your commitment!" We need more shepherds to guide our churches, and seminarians have shared how they greatly appreciate the prayers and support during formation. So, let us also pray for the success of Ivan and Benjamin's studies during the summer and afterwards until seminarian formation concludes.

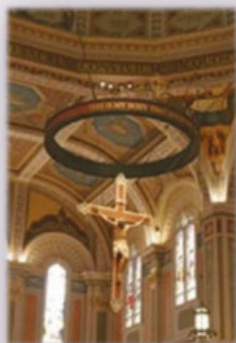

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF THE CATHEDRAL OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT. - JUNE 26



The Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, dedicated in June 1889 As one of the largest cathedrals west of the Mississippi, it accomplishes the effective blending of glory and grace.


Within this beautiful church are many breathtaking features inspiring faith and sharing history, including the Cathedra (Bishop's chair), a spectacular dome, a 13-foot crucifix, a tabernacle tower and a 100-year-old

sanctuary lamp. The resplendent art, which encircles the dome and adorns the chapels, masterfully conveys Scripture and God's saving grace.

"The beauty of the Cathedral also reflects God's awesome beauty and instills in us a yearning to be caught up in the beauty and life of God. When we pray in the Cathedral and ponder the Divine Mysteries referred to in the artwork and design, we experience a foreshadowing of heaven, a foretaste of eternal union with God. Consequently, the Cathedral entails much more than what meets the eye. For the broader community, too, the Cathedral is a powerful symbol of God's presence, and of the transcendent dimensions of life, as well as a reminder to attend to one's spiritual hungers and needs."
