



GOSPEL REFLECTION

Life in the Spirit

We are all familiar with the refrain, "You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!" In Baptism, we "put on" Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means. It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God's vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life's journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God's unconditional love to my hurtful memories and sinful choices. With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn't it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced!

FAITH LIKE A CHILD



OLA PARISH COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Attendance per Mass will be limited to approximately 100 persons, with overflow in the hall.



WEAR MASKS

All participants in the church or in the hall are required to wear masks throughout the Mass, except for children under two years of age and anyone who has difficulty breathing.



USE HAND SANITIZER

Participants are asked to use the hand sanitizer when entering the church.



MAINTAIN PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Physical distancing remains the norm. Families may sit together and have more than 4 in a row. Two couples can sit together, 1 couple at each end.



ENTRANCE & EXIT

The entrance to the church will be the side door on the rectory side of the church. Social distancing should be maintained while awaiting to enter. Exiting will be through the church doors at the back of the church.



HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be distributed as usual. Make sure you do as indicated below:

- Keep your mask on until you receive the Body of Christ.
- Receive the Body of Christ on hand. Step to the side and consume.
- · Maintain physical distancing at all times.



OFFERTORY

A basket will be placed at the entrance to the sanctuary for participants to drop off their offerings when arriving to the Mass. A basket will be placed in the Parish Hall also.



AVOID SOCIALIZING AFTER MASS

You are encouraged to avoid socializing and fellowship after Mass, if possible or at least minimize it.

We are all are called to greater charity and understanding.

Draw God holding you on his lap while sitting in your favorite rocking chair.



Extra Ordinary Times: Virtual Young Adult Retreat



SPIRITUAL GROWTH



WHY IS JULY DEDICATED TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST?

One particular devotion in the Catholic Church connected to the Passion of Jesus Christ is the honoring of his Precious Blood. It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century when a universal feast was established.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood.

While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honor of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter.

On August 10 he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.
