SCHOOL NEWS

Build up your child's conscience

Temptations come at our children from all directions. A strong conscience is a surefire way to help fight temptation. Here are some suggestions: **Obedience before understanding.** Expect youngsters to do what is right at as young an age as possible, instead of waiting they understand why. Then good behavior is a habit that will be hard to break. **Right and wrong are not negotiable.** Peers can devise clever arguments to justify sinful behavior, but right and wrong are absolutes. As Catholics we know that "right" is anything that God has told us to do, and we have Scripture, the Catechism, and other reliable sources from which to draw. Anything counter to this is wrong.

Repent and repair. If a child does something wrong, he needs to make amendments. This means to ask forgiveness of the person hurt, repair the damage, and make things right with God through Confession. When wronged, he must forgive and move on.

Demonstrate love. When youngsters feel loved, they are more receptive to our guidance.

DID YOU KNOW?

July is the Month of the Precious Blood

Having closed the month of June, where we pondered the merits and graces of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in July we enter into the mystery of His Precious Blood.

It was in the mid-Nineteenth century that Bl. Pope Pius IX instituted the Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. He did so in thanksgiving for his return to Rome, having been driven out by Italian revolutionaries to Gaeta. Later, Pope St. Pius X placed the Feast on the first of July and following the Feast, the whole month is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus Christ.

Among devotions to the humanity of Christ (e.g., Divine Infancy, Sacred Heart), the Precious Blood of Jesus has the most biblical precedent since it is mentioned so frequently in the New Testament (over 75 times).

Voice Your Opposition to the Attack on the Seal of Confession

You are invited to attend the California Assembly Public Safety Committee on Tuesday, July 9, 2019 – 9:00 AM at the California State Capitol, Room 126. This meeting is open to all. Voice your opposition to Senate Bill 360.

The "seal of confession" is one of the most sacrosanct of Catholic beliefs and penitents rely on this unbreakable guarantee to freely confess and seek reconciliation with God. A priest who breaks the seal is automatically excommunicated (Canon 1388).

Yet now, the California Assembly Public Safety Committee is debating SB 360, a bill proposing to eliminate the penitential communication exemption for priests and employees of the Catholic Church when it comes to child sexual abuse.

SB 360 would undermine that, create confusion, deter counseling and discourage spiritual counseling without gaining any protection for children.
