


## SUNDAY READINGS SYNOPSIS

#### OLA Fulfilling the Promise Campaign to Build a New Hall/Gym Construction update – July 2019

Summer is nearly half over, and the work continues as we get closer to construction of a beautiful new Parish Hall/Gym and a brand new Preschool. Here is what's happening:

- The County postponed the meeting for our final approval to July 17. We are ready! If all goes well, demolition will begin in August.
- Our "Donor Wall" design team is hard at work and will soon have renderings of what the Donor Wall will look like.
- Portables have been delivered and are being setup to accept our Extension students in August.
- Work is underway to get the Extension building ready to greet our preschoolers in August.
- Our new Principal (Mr. Love) and Vice-Principal (Mr. Moore) are fully involved in the logistics associated with a major construction project.

To all of our donors who have pledged \$7500 or more, be on the lookout for an invitation to a special event in mid-August. The Lucchetti/Vincent Families have offered to host a Vineyard Dinner on 8/16 to thank our most generous donors. If there is anyone below the \$7500 level who would like to increase their pledge to qualify for this event, you are more than welcome. By the way, "upping" your pledge doesn't necessarily mean you pay more each year. You might just extend the term of you pledge out an extra year or two.

The fundraising is not over. \$5.75 Million pledged is only about 75% of construction costs. Please consider a pledge so we can make sure this project is completed in its entirety!



# SPIRITUAL GROWTH

## WORDS FROM THE POPE

The Samaritan acts with true mercy: he binds up that man's wounds, takes him to an inn, takes care of him personally, and provides for his care. All this teaches us that compassion, love, is not a vague sentiment, but means taking care of the other even paying for him. It means compromising oneself, taking all the necessary steps so as to "approach" the other to the point of identifying with him: "you shall love your neighbor as yourself". This is the Lord's Commandment.

When the parable ends, Jesus reverses the question of the doctor of the Law, and asks him: "Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" (v. 36). The response is completely unequivocal: "The one who showed mercy on him" (v. 37). At the beginning of the parable, for the priest and the Levite, the neighbor was the dying man. At the end, the neighbor is the Samaritan who drew near". Jesus reverses the perspective: do not stand by classifying others by sight who is neighbor and who is not. You can become neighbor to any needy person you meet, and you will know that you have compassion in your heart, that is, whether you have the capacity so suffer with the other.

This parable is a splendid gift for us all, and also a task! To each of us Jesus repeats what he said to the doctor of the Law: "Go and do likewise" (v. 37). We are all called to follow the same path of the Good Samaritan, who is the figure of Christ: Jesus bent down to us, he became our servant, and thus he has saved us, so that we too might love as he loved us, in the same way.
