### SUNDAY READINGS SYNOPSIS



### *OLA Fulfilling the Promise Campaign to Build a New Hall/Gym Construction update – July 2019*

Summer is nearly half over, and the work continues as we get closer to construction of a beautiful new Parish Hall/Gym and a brand new Preschool.

Here is what's happening:

- The County postponed the meeting for our final approval to July 17. We are ready! If all goes well, demolition will begin in August.
- Our "Donor Wall" design team is hard at work and will soon have renderings of what the Donor Wall will look like.
- Portables have been delivered and are being setup to accept our Extension students in August.
- Work is underway to get the Extension building ready to greet our preschoolers in August.
- Our new Principal (Mr. Love) and Vice-Principal (Mr. Moore) are fully involved in the logistics associated with a major construction project.

To all of our donors who have pledged \$7500 or more, be on the lookout for an invitation to a special event in mid-August. The Lucchetti/Vincent Families have offered to host a Vineyard Dinner on 8/16 to thank our most generous donors. If there is anyone below the \$7500 level who would like to increase their pledge to qualify for this event, you are more than welcome. By the way, "upping" your pledge doesn't necessarily mean you pay more each year. You might just extend the term of your pledge out an extra year or two.

The fundraising is not over. \$5.75 Million pledged is only about 75% of construction costs. Please consider a pledge so we can make sure this project is completed in its entirety!

THANK YOU to all of our donors. This is a transformative project and you are a part of it! We will update you again after our meeting at the County offices on July 17.

### *Limiting the TV Time*

I was becoming concerned that my children were spending too much time in front of screens. Most of their conversations revolved around movies and television shows. They wouldn't miss their favorite programs but they were missing hours of their lives.

My concerns were confirmed one night when we lost power for a few hours during a long thunderstorm. No television, no computers, no iPads. The girls grew bored, cranky, and restless. Finally, I lit candles and pulled out board games. We played Dominoes, Monopoly, Trivial Pursuit, The power came back, but Kara and Dad were tied and wanted to play to the finish.

After that night, I realized we needed to make a change. In order to earn screen time, the children had to spend time reading, playing outside or doing chores. Since then, they had found other ways to have fun and don't need their devices nearly as much.

## WORDS FROM THE POPE

### *Faith as a 'Yes' to God's love for us*

Faith is our human 'yes' in response to God's divine 'yes' – just like a child's smile is a reply to its mother's. God gives his 'yes' first and faith is our 'yes' in answer to his initial 'yes'. The 'yes' of God is so massive we cannot imagine its vastness. God's 'yes' is utterly reliable and complete beyond any human completeness. Ours is hesitant, fluctuating and incomplete. God's 'yes' is huge while ours is small. God's 'yes' is eternal and stable while our 'yes' flickers on and off. God's 'yes' is embodied in Jesus, while ours often lacks bite and reality. But as we grow spiritually, we hope that we can live our 'yes' more and more out of God's strength.

Mary's 'yes' was strong with God's strength. After all, while the prospect of motherhood is daunting on its' own, the prospect of being the mother of God is completely overwhelming. Although Mary was a human being as we are, her 'yes' nevertheless mirrored God's in a way that no one else has ever managed to do. That's because her 'yes' was filled with grace. She knew she was loved infinitely by God, and this gave her a joy that was strong enough to withstand anything that came her way.

### What are the secrets of stewardship?

*"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace"* (1 Peter 4:10).

Everything we have and all that we are is given to us by God because he loves us and trusts us to be good stewards of his gifts of love.

A good steward receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes them, shares them, and returns them to God with interest.

#### **Stewardship flows from love.**

The key is to be continually aware of what God has given us and to be deeply grateful. Good stewards know that they didn't earn their talents or resources and understand that they come from a Father who asks only for true love in return.

#### **Giving feels good.**

Sharing God's gifts with those in need, whether it is our time, talents, or treasure, feels great. And, it's what Jesus asked us to do.

#### **Stewards are instruments.**

Stewardship is actually God's love flowing through us and pouring out through us. The good steward joins in God's own generous nature by acting as God's hands on Earth.

#### **God's purpose is the point.**

When we waste our talents, dawdle in pointless pursuits, or squander our resources, we put our own desires first ahead of God's will. Good stewards are God-centered rather than self-centered.
