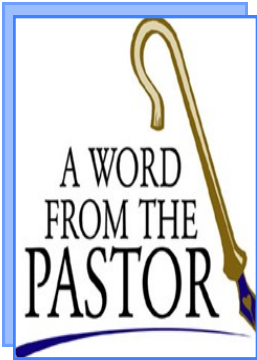

Exciting Events From The 2017/2018 School Year

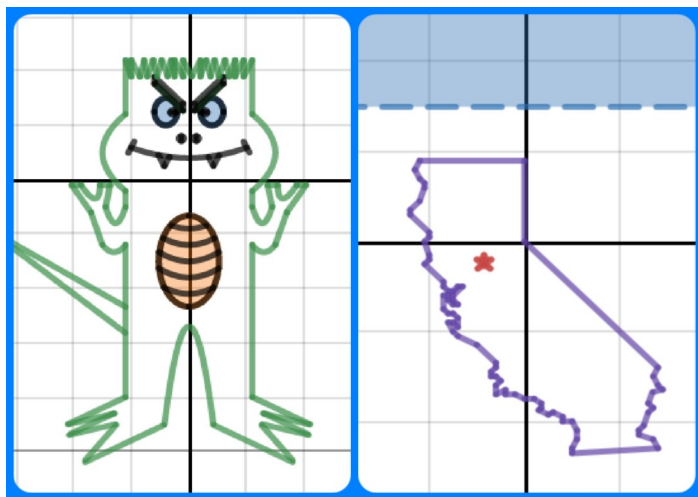
The 8th graders in Ms. McCormick's math class created artwork using [Desmos.com](https://www.desmos.com). The students were given the instructions only that their artwork must contain at least 12 lines, 6 of which must be oblique, as well as 2 inequalities.

Students completed the project almost entirely on their own on their own time. As you will see, students went above and beyond to create these masterpieces. Many students used the tools that Desmos provides in the form of pre-made graphs as well as video tutorials to teach themselves skills that go far beyond the requirements of the project and of the Algebra 1 standards.

Altar Servers light candles, hold the books, and handle the vessels, etc. so that the celebrant can focus on leading the assembly in prayer. Servers Girls and boys, 5th grade and older, are invited to participate.

Bereavement Committee Members provide caring support to those who have lost loved ones while assisting with funeral planning. Please call the parish office if you are in need of their services.

Building and Grounds Committee coordinates the regular maintenance and improvement of the parish buildings and grounds.

Catholic Daughters of America strive “to be helping hands where there is pain, poverty, sorrow or sickness.”

Eucharistic Homebound Ministers bring homebound parishioners Eucharist to their homes or care facilities.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist in the distribution of Holy Communion. Men and women (16yrs and older) must be fully initiated Catholics to participate.

Faith Formation for Children volunteers teach the Catholic Faith to our parish children once a week.

Family Promise Ministry provides fellowship and healthy meals to homeless families with children. Permanent housing is the ultimate goal, along with developing the self-sufficiency needed to sustain them.

The Parish Finance Council is a consultative body of lay parishioners who advise the Pastor in matters pertaining to the financial affairs of the parish.

Habitat for Humanity volunteers provide time and talent to build homes for families in need. Habitat's affordable, no-profit house payments free up money for food, child care, medicine and other necessities.

The Knights of Columbus is a Catholic Family Fraternal Service Organization, which assists the Church and communities in the Arden Carmichael areas.

Lectors are lay ministers who read from the Lectionary at Mass or other liturgical celebrations. Men and women who are fully initiated Catholics are invited to participate as lectors.

The Legion of Mary is an international evangelical organization dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. They bring Eucharist each week to individual homebound persons and care facilities in the area, as well as facilitating a Mass once a month at each of those facilities.

The Liturgy Committee under the direction of the Pastor, sets goals, direction and principles for the liturgical life of the parish, assesses the needs of the worshipping assembly, trains competent liturgical ministers, and implements directives from the universal Church and the diocesan church.

The Environment Committee liturgically adorns the inside of the church.

Greeters receive the community and welcome them to our Faith Family.

Ushers help worshipers find seats, take up the collection, coordinate the presentation of the gifts and give visitors necessary information.

Martha & Mary Gathering is open to all parish ladies. They meet for fellowship, spiritual growth, and to assist with parishioner funeral receptions.

Matthew 25 Ministries does not require meetings...simply bring old prescription bottles to church for shipment to third world countries!

Music Ministers offer their gifts by singing or playing an instrument in our adult and youth choirs.

Offertory Counters are volunteer teams who count the offertory collections.

The Pastoral Council is a pastoral consultative body which strives to discern the movement of the Holy Spirit among God's people in the parish. It gives its help to the Pastor in fostering pastoral activity.

P.E.R.T. (People Enjoying Retirement Together) promotes the spirit of friendship while providing opportunities for programs and activities to enhance the temporal and spiritual life of their later years.

Social Committee promotes parish unity through the planning and execution of social events like our community dinners.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) OLA Conference is a group of Catholic lay persons who respond to the needs of the poor living within the OLA parish boundaries through the twice-weekly on-site food locker and temporary assistance with rent, utilities, clothing, etc.

Jer 23: 1-6; Ps 23: 1-6; Eph 2: 13-18; Mk 6: 30-34

Most are familiar with the scriptural quote from Psalm 23, "The Lord is my shepherd. There is nothing I shall want." This passage serves as the Responsorial Psalm on this 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time because it supports the other readings with two key ideas: that we must place our trust in the Lord, and that we inherit life from our Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ.

At the time St. Paul was writing his Letter to the Ephesians (our Second Reading), Paul was under house arrest in Rome and awaiting trial. He was allegedly accused by the Jews of taking a Gentile into a temple. Therefore, part of Paul's statement, "For he (Christ) is our peace, he who made both one and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through his flesh, abolishing the law with its commandments and legal claims," is saying essentially the Lordship of Jesus is not greater than any difference you may feel you have with others — that Jesus is our Savior and our Shepherd.

In the Gospel Reading from Mark, the idea of shepherding lies at the heart. "When he (Jesus) disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things." In other words, He began to feed them with the Word of God. That is what we do during this part of our Mass; we hear Holy Scripture. These are the Words of the Lord. He is our shepherd. We are His sheep.

As always, Jesus teaches us a valuable lesson about stewardship through today's readings. To the Lord, the needs of others were more important than His own. When we share our time, our talents, and our treasure, we are not only following our Good Shepherd, we are also living His Gospel call to shepherd others by giving of ourselves.

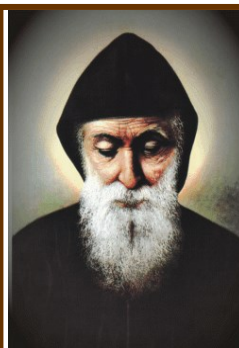

Saint Charbel Makhlouf July 24

Youssef Antoun Makhlouf was born on May 8, 1828 in Bkaakafra (North Lebanon) from Maronite parents.

Deeply devoted to God's Eucharistic presence, he suffered a stroke while celebrating the Divine Liturgy of the Maronite Catholic Church on December

16, 1898. He died on Christmas Eve of that year. Father Charbel was proclaimed a saint by Pope Paul VI on October 9, 1977. The pope explained that St. Charbel taught us by his life the true way to God. He said that our lives today give so much importance to wealth and comfort. Charbel, instead, teaches by his example the value of being poor, self-sacrificing and prayerful.
