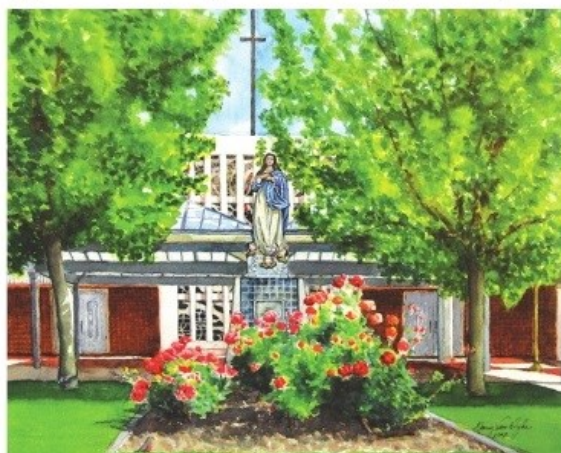

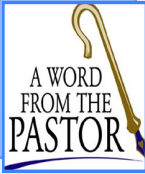


SUNDAY READINGS SYNOPSIS

The author of Wisdom speaks of "that night" of exodus from bondage in Egypt (1) when the Lord delivered his chosen people from death (Ps). The Lord will come again, perhaps in the midst of the night. Let us be prepared for his return (3). As we walk in darkness, our journey to our heavenly homeland is illumined by faith (2).

All three readings today call us to faith. The first reading recalls the night of the Passover when the Israelites celebrated their faith that God was liberating them from the slavery of Egypt. The second reading gives us the definition of faith as the evidence of things unseen and the realization of our hopes. It shows how Abraham and our ancestors in the faith trusted God and lived by faith. Jesus in the Gospel calls us to faith, not to be afraid as we await His Glorious return with Salvation for us.

DID YOU KNOW?

What do we believe about the end of Mary's life?

Catholics believe that at the end of her life Mary was taken, body and soul, into heavenly glory (Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), #966). This belief was officially stated by Pope Pius XII in 1950, but it had been held since the early Church. Mary was "full of grace" (Luke 1:28) and remained sinless throughout her life. Having carried the Son of God within her, her Assumption into Heaven preserved her body from the corruption in the grave.

POPE'S TALKS TO YOUTH

The Euromoot, held from 27 July to 3 August, covered historical itineraries in some regions of Italy, visiting five cities in Italy, each dedicated to the figure of a saint: Paul of Tarsus, Benedict of Norcia, Cyril and Methodius, Francis of Assisi, Catherine of Siena.

Meeting the thousands of young people in the Paul VI hall this morning, Francis first of all pointed out these saints as models: "They did not wait for something from life or from others, but they trusted God and took a risk, they put themselves at stake, on the way to realize dreams so great that after centuries they have done good to you too. They gave their lives, they didn't keep it for themselves". Precisely for this reason, the Pope gave the young people "five words ... Simple words, which trace a clear course. Give and it will be given to you". "First of all give. Today we immediately think of having. Many live with the sole purpose of possessing what they like... Jesus sets as a starting point not having, but giving: give, that is, and by doing so you begin to put life into play! To give means to get up from the armchair, from the comforts that make you fall back on yourself, and start walking". And he added: "In the desire to have, you lose your originality and you will become a photocopy."

SPIRITUAL GROWTH

WORDS FROM THE POPE

On today's Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the holy faithful People of God joyfully express their veneration of the Virgin Mother. They do so in the common liturgy and also with thousands of different forms of piety; and the prophesy of Mary herself takes place in the same way: "all generations will call me blessed" (Lk 1:48). Because the Lord has raised his humble handmaiden. Her Assumption into heaven, in body and soul, is a divine privilege accorded to the Holy Mother of God for her particular union with Jesus. It is a *corporal and spiritual union*, which began with the Annunciation and matured throughout Mary's life through her unique participation in the mystery of her Son. Mary always went with her Son: she followed Jesus and thus we say she was the first disciple.

Our Lady's existence unfolded like that of an ordinary woman of her time: she prayed, managed her family and home, and attended the synagogue.... However every daily action she performed was always done in total union with Jesus. And on Calvary this union culminated, in love, in compassion and in heartache. For this reason God also gave her full participation in Jesus' *Resurrection*. The body of the Blessed Mother was preserved from corruption, like that of the Son.

Today the Church invites us to contemplate this mystery: it shows us that *God wishes to save the whole man*, that is, to save *soul and body*. Jesus rose with the body he had assumed from Mary; and he ascended to the Father with his transfigured humanity; with his body, a body like ours, but transfigured. The Assumption of Mary, a human being, gives us confirmation of what our glorious fate will be. Greek philosophers had already understood that the soul of man is destined to happiness after death. However, they disregarded the body — considered the prison of the soul — and they did not understand that God had planned for the human body to be joined to the soul in the heavenly beatitude. Our body will be there, transfigured. This — the "*resurrection of the flesh*" — is a specific element of Christian revelation, a cornerstone of our faith.

WORD OF LIFE

Abortion and Contraception

It is noteworthy that as acceptance and use of contraception have increased in our society, so have acceptance and use of abortion. Couples who unintentionally conceive a child while using contraception are far more likely to resort to abortion than others. Tragically, our society has fallen into a mentality that views children as a burden and invites many to consider abortion as a "backup" to contraceptive failure. This is most obvious in efforts to promote as "emergency contraception" drugs that really act as early abortifacients.

"With Pope John Paul II we affirm that contraception and abortion are "specifically different evils," because only "the latter destroys the life of a human being," but that they are also related (The Gospel of Life, no. 13). It is important to remember that means that are referred to as "contraceptive" are, in reality, sometimes also abortifacient. An end to abortion will not come from contraceptive campaigns but from a deeper understanding of our human sexuality, and of human life, as sacred gifts deserving our careful stewardship."
