## SUNDAY READINGS SYNOPSIS



## History of OLA School

Our parish was established in 1950 by Fr. Thomas Bannon and the vibrant Catholic Carmichael community. Fr. Bannon had a vision to construct a parish school because he believed that a Catholic education should be available for all young people of the parish as it would form them deeper in their faith and instill in them a better value system. By 1954 construction of the school began, and the Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary (IBVM) order of nuns consented to the employment of two nuns to work at the school. On September 7, 1955, the school was opened. OLA School has been flourishing since. Our school continues to enjoy an enthusiastic, supportive community, and it prepares students to become outstanding Catholics who excel in faith, academics, and service. Our Preschool and Transitional-Kindergarten were created in 2011 to meet the needs of our community. Our Principal, Mr. Robert Love, was appointed June of 2019 and looks forward to leading our school with her strong Catholic faith, love for children and education experience. OLA school continues to employ a very dedicated and enthusiastic staff of teachers with many years of service in the teaching profession and in this school community.

## Queenship Of The Blessed Virgin Mary

On the 11th of October 1954, Pope Pius XII established the Feast of the Queenship of Mary to be celebrated throughout the world, and commanded that on that day each year, the world should renew its consecration to her. In the future the Feast came to be celebrated on 22nd of August.

## **POPE'S TALKS TO YOUTH**

# What does the word of God have to say about young people?

5. Let us draw upon some of the richness of the sacred Scriptures, since they often speak of young people and of how the Lord draws near to encounter them.

#### In the Old Testament

6. In an age when young people were not highly regarded, some texts show that God sees them differently. Joseph, for example, was one of the youngest of his family (cf. *Gen* 37:2-3), yet God showed him great things in dreams and when about twenty years old he outshone all his brothers in important affairs (cf. *Gen* 37-47).

7. In Gideon, we see the frankness of young people, who are not used to sugar-coating reality. When told that the Lord was with him, he responded: "But if the Lord is with us, why then have all these things happened to us?" (Jg 6:13). God was not offended by that reproach, but went on to order him: "Go in this might of yours and deliver Israel!" (Jg 6:14).

8. Samuel was still a young boy, yet the Lord spoke to him. Thanks to the advice of an adult, he opened his heart to hear God's call: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening" (*1 Sam* 3:9-10). As a result, he became a great prophet who intervened at critical moments in the history of his country. King Saul was also young when the Lord called him to

## SOMETHING TO PONDER ON

#### **Consolation and Desolation**

We experience a great freedom, once we come to accept it is quite normal for periods of desolation to alternate with periods of consolation, when we feel comfort, joy and ease in our relationship with God. We are no longer overly dependent on the state of our feelings. Our faith has stronger, deeper roots. We learn to pray with as much confidence out of sadness, gloom and spiritual dryness as out of joy, lightness of heart and bubbling enthusiasm.

Ignatius and the wider Christian tradition assure us that when darkness comes, either from within ourselves, or from devastating events in our lives, we can still cling in faith to the Lord's words:

Can a woman forget her nursing child? Or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget.

Yet I will not forget you (Is 49:15).

Consequently, we can be as content to pray like Jacob wrestling all night with the angel (Gen 32:22-32) as like Mary, the sister of Martha, who sat quietly at Jesus' feet listening to him speak (Lk 10:38-42). One mode of prayer is not better than the other.

The pattern of alternating moods that Ignatius experienced in Manresa opened up for him the reality of a 'new life'. Such a development in ourselves is to be welcomed, not avoided, because through it God will lead us more fully into his own divine life.

# **<u>20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>** Stewardship Stance

"Do you think I have come to give you peace on Earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." LUKE 12:51

Living a *Stewardship* lifestyle means stepping out of our comfort zone when needed. Many of us like to play it safe, not cause waves, stay in the middle of the road. In today's world we are called to be informed and take a stance for life, marriage and religious liberty.

## **STEWARDHIP SAINT**

#### St. John Eudes Feast Day: August 19



St. John Eudes was a French missionary and the founder of the Congregation of Our Lady of Charity, and was also the author of the liturgical worship of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

St. John was born at Ri, France on November 14th, 1601. At the age of fourteen he took a vow of chastity

and since the time he was a child he tried to live in imitation of the Lord Jesus. When he was ordained a priest in 1625, at the age of 24, he was immediately thrust into the service of victims of the plague, whom he cared for at great risk to his own life. He also began preaching missions and was known as the greatest preacher of his age, preaching missions all over France, especially throughout Normandy. In 1641 he founded the Congregation of Our Lady of Charity of the Refuge, to provide a refuge for prostitutes. In 1643 he founded the Society of Jesus and Mary for the education of priests and for missionary work.

He was also instrumental in encouraging devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Holy Heart of Mary, writing the first book ever on the devotion to the Sacred Hearts, "Le Coeur Admirable de la Très Sainte Mère de Dieu". He died at Caen, on August 19th, 1680.

His virtues were declared heroic by Leo XIII, on January 6th, 1903. The miracles proposed for his beatification were approved by Pius X, May 3, 1908, and he was beatified April 25th, 1909. He was canonized in 1925.
