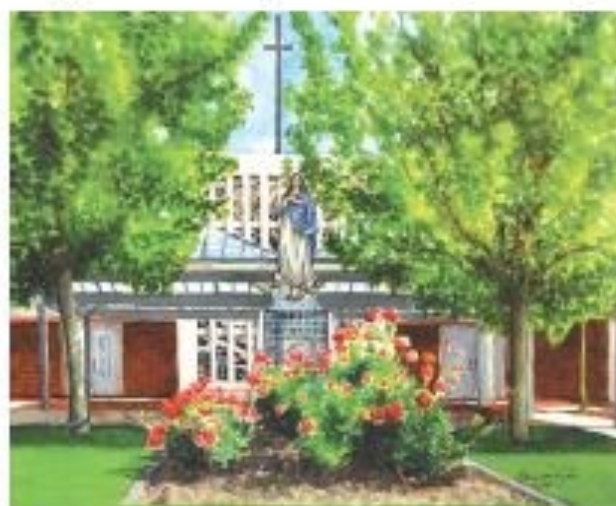

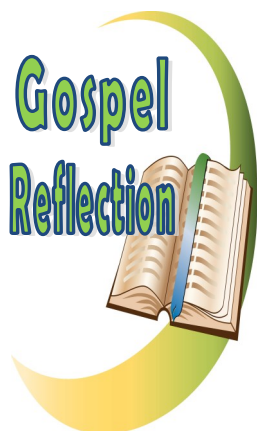

What Is Inside Your Heart? It Will Only Come Out Of It What's Inside

Orange Juice

I was preparing to give a talk and I decided to bring an orange to illustrate what I was going to say. I started a conversation with a young man who was sitting in the front row, and I said,

- If I squeezed this orange as hard as I can, what would come out?

He looked at me as if I was silly and said,

- Juice, of course!

- Do you think apple juice would come out of it?

- No! (He said laughing).

- And grapefruit juice?

- No, not grapefruit juice.

- What would come out of it?

- Orange juice, of course.

- Why? Why is it that when I squeeze an orange, orange juice comes out?

- Well, it's an orange and that's what's inside.

I nodded and said,

- True. Let's assume that this orange is not an orange, but it is you and someone squeezes you or puts pressure on you, and tells you something that you don't like; this offends you and anger, hatred, bitterness and fear come out of you. Why do these come out?

The young man said,

- Because that's what's inside.



This is one of the great lessons in life: What comes out of you when life squeezes you, when someone causes you pain or offends you? If anger, pain and vengeance are the things that come out, it's because that's what's inside. No matter who offends you, whether it is your mother, your brother, your children, your boss, etc.

If someone does or says something to you that you don't like, what comes out of you is what's inside. When someone squeezes you and love comes out, it's because that's what you have allowed to be in you.

Today there is an orange for you and me. Now, we have to reflect what's inside us, because "the things which proceed out of the mouth, come forth from the heart" [Matt 15:18].

They "squeezed" Jesus and the only things that came out for Him for us were forgiveness, blood of love and mercy. He gave us a living example that. Although he was insulted, he was lacerated, humiliated and treated even worse than a criminal, He only gave us love and forgiveness!

What do we do when we are squeezed? What are our actions, words and feelings? Those of Jesus?

"Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine."

Questions of the Week

Theme: We are called to serve others.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear the familiar teaching of Jesus in this Gospel, what word or phrase strikes you? What image lingers in your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What are some specific ways in which you can serve your friends or family members?

Question for Youth: Sometimes, when we strive to be first or be the one that wins, we hurt others. When has striving to be first hurt others? What can you do differently in the future to help others to succeed?

Question for Adults: Is the role of being a servant for others easy or difficult for you to embrace?

Something to think and pray about this week

We find it extremely hard to accept undeserved service and forgiveness and love from anyone, and especially from Jesus. For we cannot do anything to earn his love; worse yet, we know how often we betray him and what he stands for. And he tells us what he is about: "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you" (John 13:12–15).

Perhaps part of our reluctance to accept his forgiveness derives from the realization that we will then be called to give up our own grudges. But the deepest level of reluctance comes, it seems, from the difficulty of accepting an absolutely free gift. But when we do accept it, we can experience the effusion of Peter: "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" (John 13:9).

St. Vincent de Paul Feast day: September 27

Most of us know his common life: He was born poor in the French village of Pouy on April 24, 1581. He founded the Congregation of the Mission and the Daughters of Charity with St. Louise de Marillac. He died September 27, 1660.

During the feast day homilies, we hear some of the amazing works that he did for the poor, but here are some little known facts about the life of this amazing saint.

1. Vincent went into the priesthood to retire and live comfortably

Vincent was born into a peasant family who lived humbly through hard work and frugality. His father encouraged him to become a priest. He decided to follow his father's advice. He would become a priest so that he could get an office in the Church, earn enough money to retire early, and then go home and provide for his family. Little did he know what God had planned for him.

2. He was kidnapped

St. Vincent was ordained in 1600. In 1605, he left to go on a mission trip. On the way, he was captured, shipped to Tunis, and sold as a slave for two years. He managed to escape and returned to France.

3. He was accused of theft

After trying and failing to advance himself in to higher ranks of the church, St. Vincent was falsely accused of theft by his roommate. Because he no longer cared about his public image, he did not defend himself. St. Vincent humbled himself like our Lord. The real thief finally confessed years later.

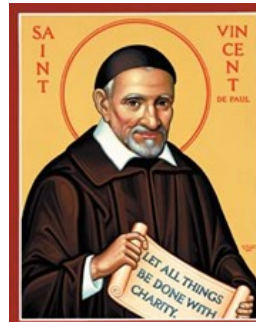
4. The confession of a dying man changed his life

When he returned to France to be chaplain and tutor to the Gondi family, he heard the confession of a man who lived at the estate who was dying. Before the man died, he convinced Madame de Gondi to endow Vincent and get him to preach on confession. When Father Vincent spoke about the power of confession, he led so many of the poor to reconcile that he had to recruit more priests!

Saint Vincent realized the need for priests to minister to the poor of France, the people many forgot about because of their lack of position in society. About this same time, he finally realized his occupation as a true vocation and recognized his relationship with Jesus Christ.


5. He was a man with a temper

St. Vincent had a mean temper. He often prayed that God would slow his anger. It didn't happen overnight, but his work with the poor ultimately softened his heart and he became the kind and tender man God called him to be.
