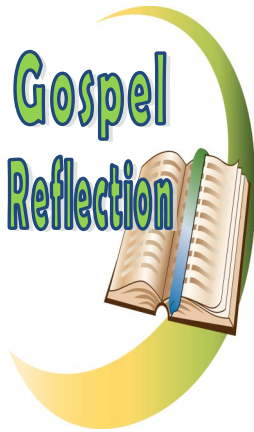

There's certain definiteness in the gospel today. Like a team going on a field – to win. We are either with Jesus or against him, and this is proved in our way of life with others. Following Jesus means not being better or different than others, it means throwing ourselves into the everyday life and needs of people and giving what we can.

It comes out also in public life. We can make our voices heard about issues which deeply affect others, like respecting and protecting life, like ensuring we care for our children in fact as well as in law, legislating wisely about marriage, in how we legislate for the care of our elderly. We may work to free our country from the effects of addiction with drugs and alcohol.

Jesus is asking for a definite way of life and of wanting to make a difference. Faith is more than assent of the mind, but a way of life and of trust – a way of life in not hindering others, but helping with compassion and good deeds. Our way of life is a sharing of faith one to another, as Pope Francis says, "Faith is passed on by contact, from one person to another, just as one candle is lighted from another."

The people who make a difference are building blocks rather than stumbling blocks. Every good cause will have its begrudgers. The apostles themselves were like that and bit by bit realized that following Jesus can be seen in many ways, and in the giving of cold water or hot soup, or in any way, making a big difference in life is being a true follower.

OLA Fall Ordinary Time Youth Choir and Ensemble

All parish and school students grades 3-12 are welcome to participate in our next session for Youth Choir and Ensemble during Fall Ordinary Time. We will sing and play for three Sundays at the 9:30 am Mass: October 7, and October 28. We will rehearse on Wednesday evenings from 6:00-6:55 pm in the church from August 29 - October 24. Please join us!

Our OLA Youth Choir and Ensemble is part of our parish effort to offer musical and liturgical education for our young people. This group is open to students grades 3-12 and is primarily scheduled to serve at select 9:30 am Sunday Masses and at other special liturgies. Participants learn about the various liturgical seasons, the structure and sequence of the Mass, liturgical participation and leadership, and basic vocal technique and musicianship. This group has three sessions: Fall Ordinary Time, Advent and Christmas, and Lent and Easter. If students participate in all three sessions, they will sing/play for at least nine Masses throughout the year and experience participating in Masses during all of the liturgical seasons. We also have special events that children can sing for, such as First Eucharist and Confirmation.

A Month of Dinnertime Conversations

Your family is important! And dinnertime is one of the best opportunities to strengthen your family, learn about each other's days, and to share and grow in your Catholic faith.

The following is an entire month's worth of dinnertime conversation starters. They are meant to help you discuss your faith and grow together in understanding what it means to be a Catholic family. We recommend that each night your family joins together for dinner, prays grace before your meal, and then discusses one of the questions below. You can also pray grace after meals.

Try this for a month and be amazed at how God will make himself present in your family.



Dinnertime Questions: (one for each night of the month)

1.	Name your favorite thing about being Catholic.
2.	Who is Jesus Christ and why does He love us?
3.	Division within families is more common today than in the past. Some families do not have both a mom and a dad, or maybe siblings or parents fight with each other. How can the love and mercy of Jesus Christ fix relationships that are broken?
4.	What does it mean in the creation story that "God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him?"
5.	How does the love between a mom and dad mirror the absolute love with which God loves us?
6.	Knowing that God gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation so that we can experience forgiveness when we fail Him, how do you feel before going to Confession and how do you feel afterward?
7.	How is our family called to greatness? (Hint: God wants everyone to be with Him for all eternity in heaven. How does our family help people get to heaven?)
8.	Family is often referred to as "the domestic church," a place where God is worshipped and adored and his will is sought and acted upon. What does that mean? How does our family act as "the domestic church" at home?
9.	Why are we Catholic? (Perhaps one of the family members can share a story of why Jesus is important in his/her life)
10.	St. Augustine said that the three goods that define marriage are the good of children, the gift of fidelity (faithfulness) between spouses, and the good of the unbreakable bond. How are the three goods of marriage seen in our family?
11.	We are called to be holy, to be saints. How can we help each other in our family to grow in virtue so as to become saints?
12.	Pope Benedict XVI once said that the evangelization of society begins with the family. What is evangelization, and how does our family participate in that? How could we do become better at evangelizing?
13.	What is something about Catholicism that confuses you, or that you want to know more about? How can you learn more about that topic so it is not as difficult to understand?
14.	Name a time when Jesus answered one of your prayers in an unexpected way.
15.	Pope Francis said that the family is "where Jesus grows; he grows in the love of the spouses and grows in the life of the children." What things can we do to "help Jesus grow" in our home and family?

Where do you fit in?

Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos Feast day: October 5

Francis Xavier Seelos was born in Fussen, Bavaria, on January 11, 1819. He studied philosophy at the University of Munich and began theology as a diocesan seminarian. After visiting the Redemptorists in Altötting, where he heard of their missionary work in North America, he decided to join them.



With their approval, he set off for the United States in 1843 where he made his novitiate. He made his profession in Baltimore in May 1844 and was ordained a priest there in December. His first assignment was to St. Philomena's in Pittsburgh where he served for six years as assistant under the leadership of John Neumann, who was pastor and superior of the community.

He was appointed pastor of St. Alphonsus in Baltimore, 1854; pastor and prefect of students at Sts. Peter and Paul in Cumberland, MD, 1857; and pastor and prefect of students at St. Mary's in Annapolis, Md., 1862.

Replaced as prefect of students, he preached missions in German and English throughout the Northeast and Midwest. Father Seelos was always an active and highly successful missionary. He was particularly devoted to the confessional, and was revered as an exceptional confessor and spiritual director. After a year as assistant pastor of St. Mary's in Detroit in 1866, he was assigned as pastor of Assumption Parish in New Orleans. There he made a great effort to care for the poor, sick, and neglected. While caring for victims of yellow fever, he contracted the disease himself. Only a year after being assigned, he died in New Orleans on October 4, 1867. He was beatified in 2000.

The holiness of Blessed Francis X. Seelos consisted of his joyful performance of his daily duties, and bearing his daily cross. He teaches us, that true holiness is possible to all, and that the Lord calls us all to be holy in every walk of life, serving God and neighbor from a full and devoted heart.
