GOSPEL MEDITATION

January 5, 2025 The Epiphany of the Lord *Matthew 2:1-12*

Have you ever wondered *why* the magi had gold, frankincense, and myrrh? Matthew's Gospel tells

us, **"Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh**"

(*Matt. 2:11*). Why are these things their "treasures"? One possible answer is they were magicians and astrologers, and these three items were the tools of their questionable trade. In offering them to Christ, they demonstrate that they will cease using such items to predict or control life. They place this babyking, the God of Israel, at the center of their lives, and not their own devices of control, manipulation and prediction.

Isn't that what we need to do, too? Consider, for example, the magical power of money, symbolized by the magi's gold. Seemingly whatever we ask of money, it does. It wields a god-like power over the world. It can predict the future by guaranteeing better outcomes for us – which is why it is such a tempting alternative to trusting in God. The problem is such absolute trust in money enslaves us to the economic forces that make money so powerful. In paying homage to Jesus with "gold" (i.e., tithing), we participate in his authority over (and therefore freedom from) the magical sway of money.

What things in your life do you use to predict or control your future? What in your life seems to give you power over the world? Those are your treasures. Are you tired of feeling enslaved to them? Find a way to open them and give them to Christ, and you will be freer.

Jubilee Year - Pilgrims of Hope December 24, 2024 - January 6, 2026

A jubilee year is a time in which God's holiness transforms us. The Bible indicates that the holy year was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. In 1470, Pope Paul II declared that Holy Years would be celebrated every 25 years. Holy Year, or Jubilee Year, includes special celebrations and pilgrimages, strong calls for conversion and repentance, and special opportunities to experience God's grace through the sacraments, especially confession.

Pope Francis had dedicated this Jubilee Year to "Pilgrims of Hope". In the heart of each person dwells the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite not knowing what the future may bring. This Jubilee Year is an opportunity to be renewed in hope, in the hope of "life everlasting". Through our baptism, we are Pilgrims of Hope, opened to God's grace, nourished by Jesus Christ, and accompanied by the Holy Spirit. On this journey anchored by unending hope, we patiently yearn to see God as he is, to be living stones transformed into spiritual houses, and to await with creation for God's redemption.




Weekly Meetings at OLA

Over the past year, our parish staff has been working on a new database to improve how we manage parishioner information, registrations, and communications. The database is provided through Flocknote, which we have been using for the parish's general electronic communication for a few years. We chose Flocknote for our database because it provides on-line access and a host of applications for our parish and parishioners to use. We will be sending out the giving information for your tax records for 2024 in January through Flocknote. To accomplish this, we need to ensure the parishioner information we have on file is correct.

Here is how you can help: We ask that you take a moment to update or verify your home address, phone numbers, email addresses, and family details. Please use the link below to provide any necessary changes. This link can also be used for new parishioners who wish to register. Even if you are a long-time parishioner, kindly update your information if any details have changed using this web address: https://olaparish.net/register-us. You may also scan the QR code using the camera of your smartphone to access the link.



We will also be available after all the Masses on the weekend of January 11-12, 2025 (location to be announced) to assist you with updating your information and to instruct you on how to access your Flocknote account.

We are pleased to inform you that nearly all of our parish information has been successfully transferred to Flocknote from our previous system. Starting **March 1, 2025**, new parishioners will be able to register, current parishioners will be able to make changes to their information, and everyone will have easy access to their giving history and other important parish communications.
