



31st Sunday in Ordinary Time


Barry had a life sentence in prison for doing unthinkable crimes. He would often remark to the chaplain that he was an atheist and could not bring himself to believe in any "god." When the chaplain asked why, Barry quickly retorted that the book of Genesis speaks of God creating everything and feeling very good about it. God's creation of people and things is beautiful. Barry continued, "If there is a God who creates something and likes what He makes and that God is good, then how could He have created someone as evil as me?" The chaplain fell silent as tears welled up in his eyes. "God loves you too, Barry. The stuff that you did is another matter. God puts His image and likeness in each one of us, in our souls. How can God not love himself?" God cannot despise or hate anything or anyone. He made you. Life hurt you. He is always about unconditional love and mercy. Barry found a glimmer of hope that day and was touched by love.

Zacchaeus met love incarnate in Jesus. He knew there was something special about him, and he had to see Jesus for himself. Realizing and knowing God's unconditional, penetrating love is a game-changer. Sinners don't repulse Jesus, he wants to eat with them! We can often find ourselves conflicted about how God sees us.

We want to believe that He loves us, but other tapes playing in our heads convince us that this cannot be true. We carry our sins around like heavy sacks weighing on our shoulders. We are crippled.

God's divine blessing lives in each of our souls. It is our essential goodness, a free gift given to us by God. The beginnings of salvation's blessings are discovered when we begin to understand who God is, who we are, and how we are to act relative to our brothers and sisters. We become more focused and courageous, eager to gather up all of the fragments of our lives and become whole. Zacchaeus, after meeting Jesus, finally knew who he was. He saw his sins and his potential for goodness as a blest child of God. When we allow God to meet us and touch us in such a profound way, we find what our selfishness has lost. We are on the road to salvation.

REFLECTIONS

Priesthood

Question:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Do We Watch Jesus from a Distance?

It seems to me that Zacchaeus may have gotten more than he bargained for when he scaled that sycamore tree.

We can only speculate as to what the original intentions of the wealthy tax collector were. We know he wanted to see Jesus, of course — but what does that mean? Was he simply curious about this famous and controversial man? Was he moved by what he heard of Jesus' teachings? Was he trying to catch a glimpse, or to get close?

Whatever his initial motivations, we can safely assume he did not expect Jesus to look up and say: "Get down. I am coming to your house today." I often find myself taking the same posture as Zacchaeus in the tree. Perhaps I have a problem I'm wrestling with or a personal fault I need to overcome. At times I know I need to give of myself in ways that scare me. Whatever it is, I am watching Jesus from a distance. I am removed. Because I worry that when he gets close, he will get in my space. He will see whatever it is I don't want to deal with or tackle.

I need to remember that Jesus does not come to condemn, but to assist. It is God's desire to make us "worthy of His calling." To do that, He knows we need help. He knows we need Him in our space. I'll say this for Zacchaeus — he was ready. He jumped right down, acknowledged what he had to be ashamed of, and vowed to do better. He brought Jesus home. May we all have that same courage.

Rite of Christian Initiation
for Adults

From the RCIA Team On a recent Sunday morning, Father Eduino performed combined Rites of Acceptance and of Welcoming as part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) process. You might be wondering: "What are these Rites and why are they so important?" The Rite of Acceptance in the Order of Catechumens is an opportunity for unbaptized inquirers to assemble publicly for the first

time to declare their intention to the Church and the Church, in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members. For uncatechized baptized inquirers, the situation is different. The Church surrounds them with special care and support as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The RCIA's sequence of four formation periods and three major liturgical gateways is arranged to motivate an individual's increasing conversion to Jesus Christ. God showered His grace on our new Catechumens and Candidates with this first set of Major Rites, and they have now begun the Period of the Catechumenate. Under the leadership of Deacon Paul and his wife Sharon, along with Catechists Tim Flanigan and Bill Simpson, and with guidance from Father Eduino, two Catechumens (non-baptized inquirers) and six Candidates (uncatechized baptized inquirers) have now begun formal catechesis in the RCIA! Our new Catechumens are Monique Leacox and Nancy Cunha. Our new Candidates are Adele Hall, Christian Suyat, Joni Novak, Reinea Hunter, Stacey Nieves, and Zackary Whitney. **Here is a photo of them at their first session** Before dismissing them, Father Eduino strongly encouraged our mighty OLA community to pray for our new Catechumens and new Candidates as they move through the RCIA process that culminates at the Easter Vigil in the spring. Let us pray frequently and fervently:



Dear God, please surround our Catechumens

and Candidates with your protection and grace as they continue to open their minds and hearts to the whispers of the Holy Spirit while walking the path of conversion to full acceptance of Jesus as Lord and to full sacramental initiation. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.


