#### GOSPEL REFLECTION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

November 15, 2020 33rd Sunday in <u>Ordinary Time</u>

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.

What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely.

#### Buried in Your Backyard

I remember watching a television show about a high school that dug up a time capsule that students had buried 25 years earlier. They had buried it with the purpose of showing others many years later the trends of the day and how student life was at that time. It was a fun exercise and everyone — the current students as well as those now grown — laughed at the clothing styles, corny photos, and lack of technology from years ago.

I wonder how the former students felt about how they had grown in those 25 years. How many of them realized their high school dreams? Did they find their purpose in this world and feel fulfilled in life? Did they use the talents and gifts God gave them to really make a difference in the world?

# SCHOOL & YOUTH MINISTRY

## Seventh grader at Our Lady of the Assumption School in Carmichael is youngest presenter at scientific meeting

Alessandra "Lexi" Mauricio, presented her completed research at The American Association of Gynecologic Laparoscopists (AAGL) 49th Annual Global Congress on Minimally Invasive Gynecologic Surgery (MIGS), held virtually, Nov. 6-14. AAGL's Congress, the premier scientific conference for gynecologic surgeons from around the world, offers highquality education and cuttingedge best practices in MIGS.



Like all presenters seeking to share their research findings at the prestigious AAGL Congress, Lexi submitted an abstract summarizing her research. All abstracts submitted for consideration are meticulously graded by a scientific committee of expert surgeons who carefully select the lineup of presentations chosen for the AAGL's Annual Congress. The 12-yearold's abstract, "Do Children That Play Video Games Perform Better in Surgery?", was selected for video presentation, making her the youngest presenter to present at a professional medical conference.

Last month, Lexi began writing a manuscript for submission to medical journals. Her manuscript will be in its authentic, pure, grade-school level style of writing while presenting real medical content. Lexi shares, "I hope to inspire other young students to be involved, and conduct their own investigations, in the field of medicine and surgery."

According to Lexi, "The future of medicine and surgery relies on the next generation, and that is us, the children.



Our findings may be used to guide the creation of games that promote hand-eye coordination skills

that are important in surgery. Furthermore, the results may be used by institutions in formulating curriculum that enhance visual-motor skills in children."

#### **INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**
