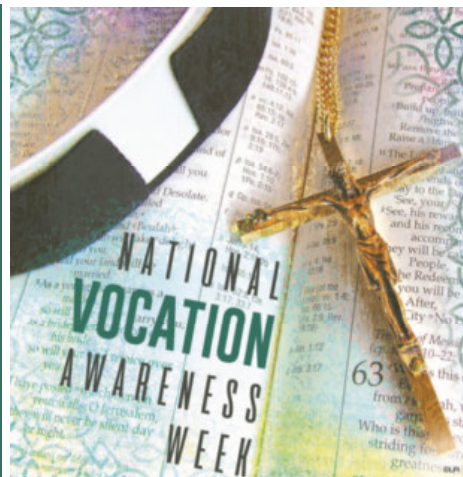

GOSPEL MEDITATION

November 6, 2022

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Facing her 50th birthday and recently diagnosed with Type-2 Diabetes, Rebecca was at a crossroads. Realizing that she had neglected her health and fitness over the years and allowed herself to gain significant weight, she felt poorly about who she had become. While it was easier to give in to temptation and the gratification received from food, her family needed her, and she desired a long life. She had an image of the person she could become. She wanted to be more trim, focused, disciplined, and healthy. She liked what she saw in her mind and set out on a journey to create it. With great effort, she succeeded and accomplished her goals. When we have a goal ahead of us, we are more apt to do whatever is necessary to get it.

Is heaven a goal you want to achieve? Our popular images and metaphors to describe heaven can leave some people wondering if this is something they want for all eternity. Living like an angel, wearing white robes, meeting St. Peter, and reconnecting with loved ones are all welcome notions to some extent. But do they really inspire and captivate us enough to want to dramatically change how we live our lives? Heaven's reality is more profound than any human image or idea can fathom. Even though we believe in a bodily resurrection, heaven is more about attaining union with God.

To achieve heaven is to attain eternal happiness and fulfill all desire. How do we awaken within us an ardent and passionate desire for heaven?

St. Isaac of Ninevah counsels, "Enter eagerly into the treasure house that lies within you, and so you will see the treasure house of heaven, for the two are one and the same, and there is but one single entry into them both. The ladder that leads to the kingdom is hidden with you, and is found in your own soul. Dive into yourself and in your soul you will discover the rungs by which to ascend." Our souls are made to be eternal. Once we discover our true selves and are captivated by the wonder of who we really are, we will unleash our unwavering desire for a lasting union with our Creator. Heaven is about who we are. "For seeing you, our God, as you are, we shall be like you for all the ages."

REFLECTIONS

Priesthood

Question:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

The God of the Living

"Sic transit gloria mundi," is what they used to say at papal coronations. "So passes earthly glory." Everything is fleeting. Nothing is here to stay. But in reality, some things are forever. Our actions on earth do have the potential to reverberate in eternity.

Everyday Stewardship is a lifestyle that embraces what will last. It is being aware of how our choices and our actions can be received by God, and through His grace, amplified to showcase His glory. Your great-grandparents were married for 60 years. Maybe they shared the greatest love anyone in your family has ever seen, and maybe they raised up a whole family of kids. But they've been gone for a generation now, and no one living remembers the softness in their eyes when they looked at each other. And to read today's Gospel, you might even get the impression that their marriage was nothing more than an earthly whim. Gone. Fleeting. Temporal. This week's readings invite us to contemplate the question: what exactly is immortal? What lasts beyond our earthly sojourn? The seven brothers and their mothers whose martyrdom is told this weekend in Maccabees didn't die for the letter of the law, they died for the One who gave the law. In the same way, a marriage contract does not extend into eternity, but the fruits of a sacrificial love will live forever. Good works, devotion, gratitude, selflessness, graciousness, accountability — these are all of God. He is not God of the dead; He is God of the living — and these are the things that last an eternity.

PLEASE PRAY FOR OUR NEW CATECHUMENS AND CANDIDATES!



From the RCIA Team On a recent Sunday morning, Father Eduino performed combined Rites of Acceptance and of Welcoming as part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) process. You might be wondering: "What are these Rites and why are they so important?" The Rite of Acceptance in the Order of Catechumens is an opportunity for unbaptized inquirers to assemble publicly for the first

time to declare their intention to the Church and the Church, in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members. For uncatechized baptized inquirers, the situation is different. The Church surrounds them with special care and support as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The RCIA's sequence of four formation periods and three major liturgical gateways is arranged to motivate an individual's increasing conversion to Jesus Christ. God showered His grace on our new Catechumens and Candidates with this first set of Major Rites, and they have now begun the Period of the Catechumenate. Under the leadership of Deacon Paul and his wife Sharon, along with Catechists Tim Flanigan and Bill Simpson, and with guidance from Father Eduino, two Catechumens (non-baptized inquirers) and six Candidates (uncatechized baptized inquirers) have now begun formal catechesis in the RCIA! Our new Catechumens are Monique Leacox and Nancy Cunha. Our new Candidates are Adele Hall, Christian Suyat, Joni Novak, Reinea Hunter, Stacey Nieves, and Zackary Whitney. **Here is a photo of them at their first session** Before dismissing them, Father Eduino strongly encouraged our mighty OLA community to pray for our new Catechumens and new Candidates as they move through the RCIA process that culminates at the Easter Vigil in the spring. Let us pray frequently and fervently:



Dear God, please surround our Catechumens and Candidates with your protection and grace as they continue to open their minds and hearts to the whispers of the Holy Spirit while walking the path of conversion to full acceptance of Jesus as Lord and to full sacramental initiation. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.
