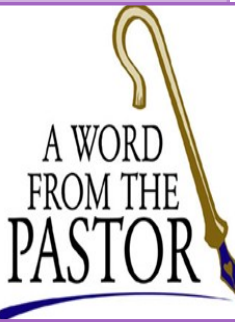

Season of Advent

First Sunday of Advent

Happy New Year! Each year, on the first Sunday of Advent, the Church begins a new year. This is our New Year's celebration which must begin with the preparations for the incarnation, or "man made flesh", of the Son of God. Let's take it a step further and understand that Jesus was begotten and not made. Mary received Him in her womb. During these four weeks of Advent, we prepare for His birth as well. We are invited to become a Church of expectancy and hope.

At the beginning of each Advent we also switch to a different year of readings. The readings for Mass are arranged as such to cover nearly the entire Bible in a three-year cycle. If you attended Mass daily you would hear a two-year cycle. The Sunday cycle consists of three years. Last year the primary Gospel writer we heard was Mark. This year, Year C, we will hear primarily from Luke.



Luke's gospel describes the second coming of Christ, the Son of Man, in cosmic terms. Rather than present us with an image of servants facing a master's unexpected return home (Year B), or a householder guarding against a thief (Year A), Luke's gospel portrays a cosmos wracked with upheaval. The sun, moon and stars, the powers of the heavens, and the roaring sea will conspire to terrify whole nations and make individuals die of fright. Yet, at the same time, this passage breathes assurance that believers will not only endure these and any other disasters, but in the very midst of them will find their salvation revealed. The bold confidence proclaimed in Luke's gospel ("When these things begin to happen, stand up straight and raise your heads...") is distinctive.

Listen to the prophet, Jeremiah, as he tells us of God's promise to raise up a "just shoot" to reign in the line of David, and of a time when the Lord God will rule over a Jerusalem fully restored and made whole. This "just shoot" found its fulfillment in Jesus of Nazareth, a descendant of the family of King David, who was sent to inaugurate the reign of God and is the very embodiment of God's justice.

Take the opportunity this Advent to steep yourselves in the traditions of our faith such as the Advent wreath. Or build a Jesse Tree which leads us through our salvific history. They are easy to find online as well.

Journey Along with Mary

No one does Advent better than our Blessed Mother. After all, she prepared her heart for the coming of Jesus for 9 months! No one knows how to receive Christ like she did – fearlessly, boldly, gently, freely, purely and completely. Ask our Mother to lend you her yes, to form your heart into a vessel. She is the perfect example of obedience and receptivity, and meditating upon her journey has helped me tremendously in understanding how to best receive our Lord each Christmas.

Picture yourself walking alongside her as she journeys to Bethlehem, holding her hand and talking excitedly about the baby – how you can't wait to meet him, what a gift He is, what color you'll paint the nursery! Pray the rosary and meditate upon the mysteries, sit with scripture, and continually look to Mary to help you get ready for Christmas. She's got your back.

Advent is a time set apart. The weeks leading up to Christmas eve are meant to be a time of prayer and joyful anticipation! It's a time to prepare our hearts for the coming of our sweet Jesus into this world as an infant, and He asks that we receive Him.

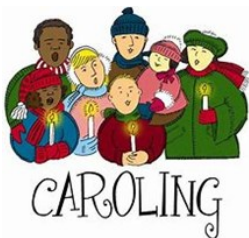

Invitation to Help Carmichael's Homeless “There but for the grace of God go I.”

Between 150 – 300 fellow residents are homeless in Carmichael. Many of them were born and raised in our area, but have fallen on hard times. Our Lady of the Assumption does much to help the poor and those in material need. Yet, homelessness remains a formidable challenge. At the beginning of the New Year, our parish has the opportunity to help the homeless even more, in a very simple but profound way. Throughout nine weeks in January and February, the Carmichael Homeless Assistance Resource Team (composed of faith communities, the public and private sectors, and concerned individuals) will feed and provide shelter for the homeless at various local churches. Three of our neighbor churches, will each host one of the nine weeks of Winter Sanctuary. They need our help. The three churches and the dates they will need help include:

- St. John the Evangelist (5751 Locust Ave.): Wednesday, January 2 from 4:30 pm through Thursday, January 3 at 6:30 a.m.
- American River Community Church (3300 Walnut Avenue): Wednesday, January 16 from 4:30 pm through Thursday, January 17 at 6:30 a.m.
- Crossroads Church (7100 Fair Oaks Boulevard): Wednesday, February 27 from 4:30 pm through Thursday, February 28 at 6:30 a.m.
