GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE December 6, 2020 **2nd Sunday of Advent**

Question for Adults: When you hear Isaiah comfort the people by promising that God is like a shepherd who gathers the lambs into his arms, what is your response?





The following diocesan and county guidelines are still in place:

The congregation is asked to not sing or chant during the Mass.

Wear your face mask and maintain physical distancing of six feet while in line to receive Holy Communion. You are encouraged to receive in the hand.

Upon receiving the Body of Christ, step to one side and consume.

If you are sick or feel unwell, please stay home. Dispensation from Mass is still in effect for all of the faithful.

Thank you for following the diocesan and county guidelines, which allow us to to have the public celebration of the Mass.
