GOSPEL MEDITATION

Third Sunday of Advent

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so? We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume). Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends. Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him?

The simple, symbolic answer the Gospel presents to us this week might surprise us: we believe because of John the Baptist. Early in John's Gospel we hear: "There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him." The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus. This is a historical fact, and it is also now a pattern at work in our lives.

John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people. And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this. He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others. In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life. Consciously thank God for their testimony. And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light. -Father John Muir ©LPi

Hats for the Homeless Update

Hats, hats and more hats!!! The weather is getting cold, and the distribution has begun! So far the Super Fritz Fund for the UC Davis Pediatric Cancer Center has received 75 hats. The OLA Giving Tree this year has 75 families signed up (176 adults and 148 children ages 1-17) and will get 100+ hats. The Carmichael HART program that occurs every Saturday at Carmichael Presbyterian Church has received 50 hats and will be kept stocked as the homeless come weekly for a hot meal, warm clothing, free haircuts, clean clothes, and wellness checks by student nurses under supervision of an RN instructor (blood pressure, blood sugar checks, skin checks). God's Bounty at St. Ignatius has received hats as well as Mercy Pedalers, just to name a few of the causes that the hats will support.

Boxes for hats are in the back of church. Drop off homemade hats or ready-made store-bought hats. They are collected weekly. We need 2,000 hats to get through the winter. Thank you for your generosity and support.
