

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

#### ADVENT 2024 – WEEK 4: LOVE

As in all the cycles of the liturgical year, we finish Advent with a Gospel reading of Mary. Here are two women, one exulting in her special condition because she was beyond childbearing years, never having had a child, and the other bewildered by her predicament yet accepting her state. This is a story of two women, wholly insignificant and living their mundane lives. But like "Bethlehem-Ephrathah too small to be among the clans of Judah," God chooses them to be the vessels of His Glory.

Theirs is the story of all greatness that bears forth in vulnerability, entrusted to the natural processes of human life. God comes forth in Jesus the Christ to accompany us in harmony with the suffering of all of us small and little people, to teach us the value of human life and the greatness of each life. Mary and Elizabeth embraced their littleness, their smallness so that God could allow us to grasp our eternal value.

Why does God choose what is ordinary to hold the radiance of the divine – "And how does this happen to me?" Might it be that we mistake what is loud and flashy for what is truly marvelous? Whatever the case, God's choice should encourage all of us. The mystery of the Incarnation comes to ordinary people living ordinary lives. What is required is openness to do God's will, a willingness to respond to God's call, "Behold, I come to do your will."

As we stand at the threshold of Jesus' second advent, we should prepare by realizing that the radiance of God shines forth through faithfulness in the ordinary events of life. This is how God chose to come, not had to come, through the joy and bewilderment of two simple, extraordinary women, whose hearts were open to God.

# Catholic Q and A: Christmas Gifts

**Question:** Why do we give gifts at Christmas? **Answer:** Great events in and of themselves are not tangible. They occur in life but leave no mark behind, nothing that someone could come across and know that something significant occurred. So we mark the event with monuments, holidays, gold watches or plaques, making a meaningful event tangible and memorable.

Gifts at Christmas do the same thing. They mark the occasion of the birth of Jesus, communicating a bit of the joy of the day by allowing us to be both giver and receiver. Gift-giving sets aside the day as special and different. The special foods, customs, decorations, and gifts all help focus our attention on the importance and meaning of the day and at the same time allow us to share personally in its joy and happiness.

In giving gifts, though, we can share in the meaning of Christmas in a significant way. We imitate God in sharing with others. We give a bit of ourselves to others in the gifts we give, just as God gives us the gift of his Son. No wonder we often say that the best gifts are those that come from the heart. Given in love, these presents are wrapped in the best covering of all.
