

Today's Gospel tells us about a painful experience



St. Vincent de Paul's Services, Operation and Support

This weekend 29th and 30th, the second collection will be for Our Lady of Assumption's St. Vincent de Paul ministry. You, our OLA parishioners, have been most generous in your support for the poor living within



OLA's parish boundaries. Since October, needy families were helped with \$6,098.45 for rent, utilities, beds, furniture, clothing and other essentials. Also since October 1st, 3,002 people were given food including full Thanksgiving dinners for 173 families totaling 626 people. The food locker is open two mornings a week, giving a minimum of three meals for three days for each member of the household. Clients may come every 14 days. Food donations are appreciated from the OLA ministries, OLA students, and individual parishioners dropping off nonperishable items in the containers in the back of church. The Youth Group's "Soap for Souls" toiletries bags are also greatly appreciated. Almost daily, volunteers pick-up food at Winco and Save Mart stores and twice-weekly trips are made to the Sacramento Food Bank for much needed basics. Anyone interested in being a part of OLA's St. Vincent de Paul ministry as either a Food Locker or Home Visitation volunteer may talk with a member or call (916) 481-6352 for information. Our local needy would not be assisted without your OLA parishioner support. Stamped envelopes for your use are in the pew racks. If you are away for the Fifth Sunday collection, envelopes may be dropped in another collection or left at the parish office. Thank You! May God's blessings be yours at this most holy season!






