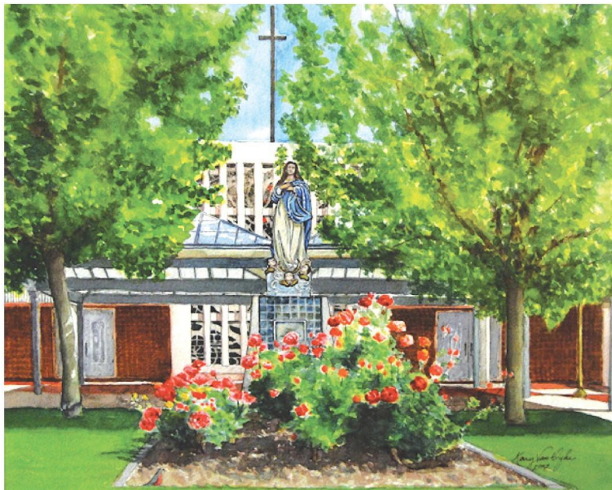

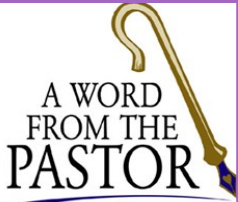

## The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

**J**esus planned our Redemption from all eternity. To bring about the forgiveness of our sins and make us children of God He charted a course of action. Jesus wanted to come into the world without being noticed, without a house, without money, without a cradle, without possessions... but not without a family, a Holy Family. He didn't want us to be left without that Holy Family either and now Mary is our Mother, Joseph our father, Jesus our Brother and we... the privileged members of the Family of Nazareth.



Today's Gospel tells us about a painful experience for Mary and Joseph: the loss of Jesus. Families exist so that joys and sorrows can be shared, so that my joy can also be others' joy and my sufferings would never only be mine. Today the family is the main target of the enemy, because he knows, as St John Paul II said that "as the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live." So we have a battle to fight.

How can I change the world? What can I do for my community, my city, my country, for peace in the world? The answer is simple: love your family; love each of the members of your family, as they are, taking the bitter with the sweet. Family love is powerful. Family unity is a hammer blow on the devil's head! An army of families in which its members love each other, who share joys and sorrows, who pray together, who place God at the center and holiness as the common goal. That army can change the world. Families are under attack but in this violent battle that we fight, family is also the weapon! Let us pray today for all the families of the world, especially for those that are suffering most.

Mary, Queen of the Family, St Joseph, my father and lord, we entrust to you all the families of the world so that you may protect them, defend them, comfort them, fill them with supernatural love and bless them with unity.

## Mary, the Holy Mother of God

**M**ary, the Holy Mother of God, is the beginning. It just makes sense. She initiated our Redemption. She opens the New Year also. Is there any better way to kick off? You have heard that *a good start is half of the battle*. Let's make that good start today, with Our Lady.



We are still in the Christmas Season and we are reminded of Our Mother keeping all the memories of Jesus and "pondering" them in her Immaculate Heart. Christmas is a season to focus our sights on Jesus. There is no better way than to learn from Mary. To look at Him with the loving eyes of Our Lady. St John Paul II invites us to contemplate the Virgin's gaze on her Child: *"The contemplation of Christ has a remarkable model in Mary. In a unique way the face of the Son belongs to Mary. It was in her womb that Christ was formed, receiving from her a human resemblance which points to an even greater spiritual closeness. No one has ever devoted himself to the contemplation of the face of Christ as faithfully as Mary."*

We hurry like curious little children to come and see Jesus always in the arms of His enraptured Mother. As you are little you can get really close; in the arms of Mary there is room for two, Jesus and you. There, in silence, you look at Him and smile at her; you contemplate them both and you learn to love.

And in the arms of Mary, beside that beautiful Baby, we promise for the New Year to struggle to be good children of Mary, to remain in her arms during the whole year, to try to grow in love with Jesus. Throughout this year that we begin today, with the Grace of God, may I keep my eyes on Jesus and, from your lap, Mary, my Mother, may I be like you, keeping a permanent dialogue with Jesus every single one of the 365 days of this year.

**O** Holy Family of Nazareth, community of love of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, model and ideal of every Christian family, to you we entrust our families. Open the heart of every family to the faith, to welcoming the Word of God, to Christian witness, so that it becomes a source of new and holy vocations. Touch the hearts of parents, so that with prompt charity, wise care, and loving devotion they be for their sons and daughters sure guides towards spiritual and eternal values. ## ***Second Collection December 29th/30th***

This weekend, December 29th/30th, the second collection is for *St. Vincent de Paul Society*.

## ***St. Vincent de Paul's Services, Operation and Support***

This weekend 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, the second collection will be for Our Lady of Assumption's St. Vincent de Paul ministry. You, our OLA parishioners, have been most generous in your support for the poor living within OLA's parish boundaries. Since October, needy families were helped with \$6,098.45 for rent, utilities, beds, furniture, clothing and other essentials. Also since October 1st, 3,002 people were given food including full Thanksgiving dinners for 173 families totaling 626 people. The food locker is open two mornings a week, giving a minimum of three meals for three days for each member of the household. Clients may come every 14 days. Food donations are appreciated from the OLA ministries, OLA students, and individual parishioners dropping off non-perishable items in the containers in the back of church. The Youth Group's "Soap for Souls" toiletries bags are also greatly appreciated. Almost daily, volunteers pick-up food at Winco and Save Mart stores and twice-weekly trips are made to the Sacramento Food Bank for much needed basics. Anyone interested in being a part of OLA's St. Vincent de Paul ministry as either a Food Locker or Home Visitation volunteer may talk with a member or call (916) 481-6352 for information. Our local needy would not be assisted without your OLA parishioner support. Stamped envelopes for your use are in the pew racks. If you are away for the Fifth Sunday collection, envelopes may be dropped in another collection or left at the parish office. **Thank You! May God's blessings be yours at this most holy season!**
