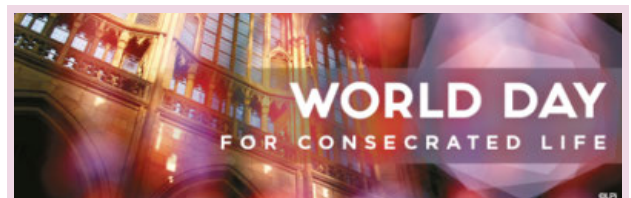

GOSPEL MEDITATION

February 2, 2025
Presentation of the Lord
Luke 2:22-40

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophesies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear – somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.

World Day of the Sick Mass 2025

Bishop Jaime Soto will preside at the celebration of the Eucharist, which includes the sacramental anointing of the sick, blessing of caregivers, and blessing with water from the Shrine in Lourdes, France.

This annual Mass is sponsored by the Sacramento Diocese and the Order of Malta and will be held on **Saturday, February 8th, at 10:00 a.m. here at Our Lady of the Assumption Church.** The Mass will also be livestreamed.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Report

On Tuesday January 21st, at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church, Bishop Soto and Bishop Bersabal along with faith leaders from other Christian traditions came together to celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This annual event occurs between January 18th – 25th.

This year's theme "We Believe" commemorated the 1700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council of Nicaea, a fundamental moment in the history of Christianity. Sponsored by the North State Ecumenical Conference, activities included a "faith sharing" meal; a panel discussion on the Nicene Creed; and a candlelit service that combined intercessory prayers, scripture readings, and music from the St. Francis school choir.

Catholic Q & A - Presentation of the Lord

Question: Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary?

Answer: February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (*Ex 13:2, 12*) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (*Lv 12:2-8*) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification. The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.

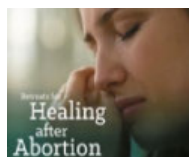
Shepherds Field Olive Wood Handcrafts
