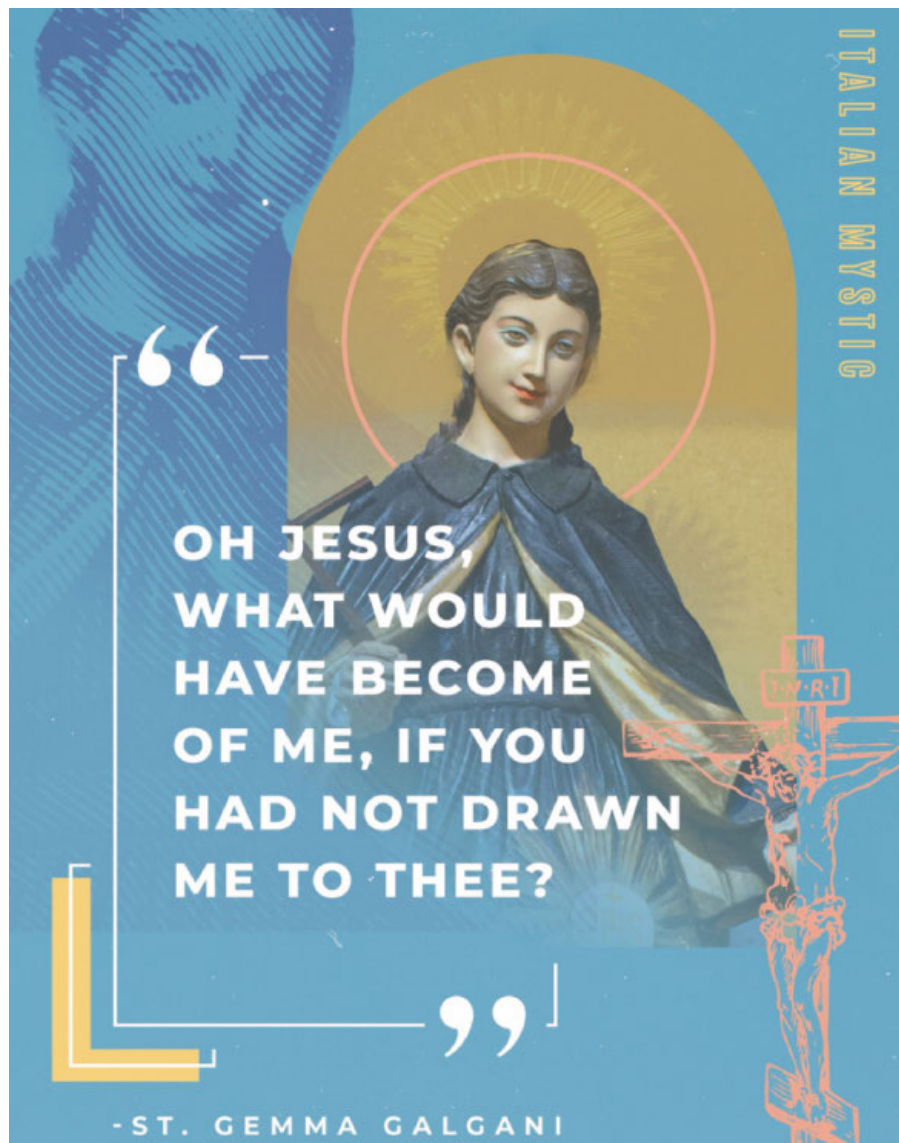

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

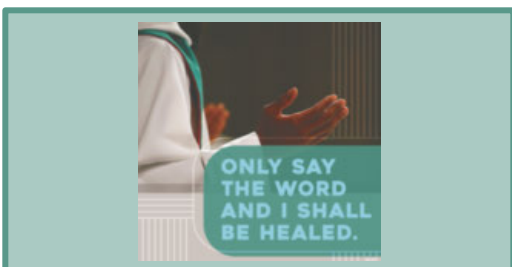
### 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Maybe I'm weird, but I like spending time in doctor's offices, confession lines in churches, auto repair shops, prison cells, and support groups of various kinds. It's refreshing to be with people who humbly admit something is wrong and forthrightly set out on a path toward a solution. When we ignore what is off kilter, we become alone and fragile. In places where people are honest and hopeful about brokenness, sturdy if subtle fellowship usually ensues.

Consider the image we see of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. "...they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by a demon. The whole town was gathered at the door." The entire human community is afflicted in various ways, and so it gradually forms a strange new community around Jesus. The healer from Nazareth is like a sun of health around which orbits a throng of humanity absorbing his healing rays. These blessed souls can't fix themselves and become healthy, and they know it. But they have found in him the living source of all imaginable healing.

It's the Church, isn't it? A sin-sick community gathered and healed is what happens at the beginning of every Mass. We shuffle in through the door from everywhere and announce that we are not okay, and we can't fix it. In doing so, we are drawn into the orbit of the healing power of Christ — and into a renewed community with the whole human family. It's nothing to fear or rush. Maybe we can even learn to enjoy more how good it is to be in such a happy place?

## Lenten Parish Mission

### "Becoming a More Eucharistic People"

#### Mark your calendars for February 24-28, 2024.

At OLA we will have a **parish Lenten Mission conducted by Father Bart Hutcherson OP from the Diocese of San Francisco**. Father Bart will speak at all of the Masses the weekend of 2/24-2/25, and there will be morning and evening sessions on Monday the 26<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday the 27<sup>th</sup>, and Wednesday the 28<sup>th</sup>. Opportunities for confession will be available. Meals will be provided for both the morning and evening sessions.

As our bishops call for a new American Eucharistic Revival, we will renew our commitment to the church's teachings about the Eucharist and examine how the Eucharistic liturgy offers a pattern for a rich Christian life, fulfilling Jesus' command to take the Gospel to four corners of the world.



**Fr. Bart Hutcherson, OP**  
is friar of the Western  
Dominican Province.

**Ordained for 26 years, Fr. Bart currently serves as an itinerant preacher, traveling to offer parish missions, retreats, and pilgrimages.** He also teaches homiletics at the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology in Berkeley, California.

Fr. Bart's preaching ministry is rooted in his devotion to the Word of God. Also a photography hobbyist, Fr. Bart uses imagery in his teaching and preaching, and is the author of *For the Beauty of the Earth: Experiencing the Glory of God in the Wonders of the 49th State*, a collection of photos and reflections completed during an extended period of ministry in Alaska.
