

God Delights in You

A single mother who has a child with special needs works two jobs and sacrifices much of her own pleasures in order to be available for her son. Being the best mother possible is important to her and brings her joy. We are willing to make great and often heroic sacrifices for those people and things that matter most to us. Unless there is something of obvious importance to us in our immediate path, we can easily approach life in a more haphazard and chaotic way. We jump from one thing to another, responding to whatever it is that is competing for our attention at that moment. When everything is important, nothing is important. If we do not wear the right pair of glasses, we can get all too easily caught up in the superficial stuff and neglect paying attention to the things that really matter. The kingdom of God is like the pearl of great price that is worth selling everything for so that it can be obtained. Based on where I invest my time and energy each day, I really wonder whether I am serving God's kingdom or my own. Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your time? You may be surprised! We allow our agendas to set the clock of our lives. We forget that joy and a true sense of purpose are not going to be found in following that timepiece. Joy is the expression of the happiness that is discovered when living in the kingdom of God. When our agenda matches God, not only do we leap for joy but God leaps with delight as well. Our well -being is what matters most to God. Can you imagine God delighting in you? It is easy to deaden

our senses to the whole reality of God and the joy that living the Gospel can bring. The demands of secular life and the agendas competing for our attention can quickly do that. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion and redirect our efforts. When we begin to see as God sees, we can rise each day and notice what really needs our attention and embrace it with exuberance. Be careful, though. It may not be what we originally had on our list. STEWARDSHIP SAINT

ST. CAMILLUS DE LELLIS PATRON SAINT OF SICK, HOSPITALS, NURSES **AND PHYSICIANS**

Feast Day: July 18 Canonized: 1746

St. Camillus de Lellis was born in 1550. When he was 16, Camillus joined his father in the army and fought in the war against the Turks.

After many years of serving in the military, Camillus worked at a Capuchin friary in Manfredonia. The guardian of the friary worked hard to bring Camillus to God, and eventually, he converted in 1575 and entered the novitiate of the Capuchin friars. He was denied admission because of an



incurable leg wound he received during the war.


Camillus then went to the San Giacomo Hospital in Rome to receive treatment. He became a caregiver, and eventually the hospital Superintendent. He studied under St. Philip Neri and lived a strict live of penance and prayer.

Camillus was ordained to the priesthood in 1584 and founded the Order of Clerks Regular, Ministers of the Infirm, also known as the Camillians. He and his followers helped wounded soldiers on the battlefield. The group was recognized by Pope Sixtus V in 1586, and they began to expand in Naples and Milan.

Camillus continued to suffer from his own wound, but allowed no one to help him, instead tending to the sick at all costs. He fell ill during a trip to inspect the hospitals of his order in Italy, and died in Rome in 1614.

Pope Benedict XIV canonized Camillus in 1746.

POPE TALKS TO YOUTH


35TH WORLD YOUTH DAY - APRIL 5, 2020

Dear friends,

Look at the real heroes who come to light in these days: they are not famous, rich and successful people; rather, they are those who are giving themselves in order to serve others. Feel called yourselves to put your lives on the line. Do not be afraid to devote your life to God and to others; it pays! For life is a gift we receive only when we give ourselves away, and our deepest joy comes from saying yes to love, without ifs and buts. To truly say yes to love, without ifs and buts. As Jesus did for us.



SPIRITUAL GROWTH



THE SIXTH SHEDDING OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

- 1. Not the hands alone, that did for man those works of love, but also the feet, that went about doing good, were pierced by the cruel nails. It seems as if men were bent on requiting the very limbs that were employed for the good of man with evil in return. They not only hated Him without a cause, but they hated Him for His love to them. Such is man when he is in Satan's power. Such have I too often been; so ungrateful to God, rebelling against the means which He employed to heal my soul and deliver me from sin.
- 2. What must have been the unutterable agony of those three hours during which the sacred body of Our Lord was dragging with all its weight on the wounds in His hands and feet! Who can describe it? The agony that racked each nerve so that there was no sound part in His body; the utter exhaustion, and, worst of all, the agonizing thirst that was the effect of the continual streams which drained His sacred body of the Precious Blood. Who can imagine it?

"Behold and see, all who pass by the way, whether there is any sorrow like to My sorrow.

3. Yet these wounds, inflicted by man's malignity, are now employed by Jesus as arguments pleading for mercy for sinners at His Father's hands.

Oh, Jesus, when shall I forgive, as Thou didst forgive me?

When shall I learn that it is a privilege and a glory to return good for evil, and so to resemble Thee?

POPE SPEAKS

CATECHESIS ON PRAYER - I The mystery of prayer


Prayer is the breath of faith, a cry arising from the hearts of those who trust in God. We see this in the story of Bartimaeus, the beggar from Jericho. Though blind, he is aware that Jesus is approaching, and perseveres in calling out: "Jesus, Son of



David, have mercy on me!" (Mk 10:47). By using the phrase "Son of David", he makes a profession of faith in Jesus the Messiah. In response the Lord invites Bartimaeus to express his desire, which is to be able to see again. Christ then tells him: "Go; your faith has saved you" (v. 52). This indicates that faith is a cry for salvation attracting God's mercy and power. It is not only Christians who pray but all men and women who search for meaning on their earthly journey. As we continue on our pilgrimage of faith, may we, like Bartimaeus, always persevere in prayer, especially in our darkest moments, and ask the Lord with confidence: "Jesus have mercy on me. Jesus, have mercy on us!".
