



GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 23, 2025 3rd Sunday of Lent John 4:5-42

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.


In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.

PARISH AND SCHOOL NEWS

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)

The Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election and Candidates for the Calling to Continuing Conversion took place at the 11:00 am Mass on March 9th. Together with their Godparents, Sponsors, and the parish community, we "sent" them to the Cathedral downtown for the Rite of Election of Catechumens and of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion celebrated by Bishop Rey Bersabal that evening. OCIA Catechumens - the newly Elect - and Candidates have now entered the Period of Purification and Enlightenment during this Lenten season.

For the newly Elect (the unbaptized), this period is a time when they "together with the local community give themselves to spiritual recollection, so that they may prepare themselves for the Paschal Feasts and for initiation by the Sacraments." (OCIA 138). It involves "more intense preparation of spirit and heart, which has the character of recollection rather than of catechesis, and is intended to purify hearts and minds by examination of conscience and penitence" while also enlightening the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior. (OCIA 139). The three Scrutinies are intended to "reveal what is weak, sick, and sinful in the hearts of the elect so that it can be healed; and what is honorable, strong and holy, so that it can be strengthened....For the Scrutinies are ordered toward liberation from sin and the Devil, and they give strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life of the elect. Moreover, the Scrutinies are set forth to purify minds and hearts, to fortify against temptations, to convert intentions, and to awaken the will, so that the elect may cling more closely to Christ and pursue more vigorously their desire to love God." (OCIA 141). To enable more members of the OLA community to participate, the three Scrutinies will take place at different Masses: the 1st Scrutiny at the 7:30 pm Mass on 3/23, the 2nd Scrutiny at the 9:00 am Mass on 3/30, and the 3rd Scrutiny at the 7:30 am Mass on 4/6. For the Candidates (baptized), this period is not only about preparing for the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, but also of Penance. The candidates participate in the Penitential Rite which is held within the Celebration of the Word as a kind of Scrutiny (OCIA 459) and may also help prepare them to celebrate their first Sacrament of Penance. (OCIA 461) In addition, all participating at the Mass will hear "the comforting message of pardon for sin, for which they will praise the Father's mercy." (OCIA 464) The Penitential Rite was held March 15 at the 5:00 pm Mass.

For each of us, the Period of Purification and Enlightenment is an opportunity to reflect on our own baptismal graces through prayer, penance, and almsgiving. Let us hold each other, especially our Elect and Candidates, their Godparents, Sponsors, and families, close in prayer during this Period of Purification and Enlightenment. May Jesus transfigure all our lives with His redeeming grace and lead us to conversion with a genuine desire to be holy as He is holy.

Catholic Q & A: Confession

Question: If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

Answer: Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.

Confessions are heard inside the church at OLA on Saturday afternoons at 3:30 p.m. You may also call the parish office to schedule an appointment.

24 Hours for the Lord will be celebrated throughout the Diocese starting at 12 noon on Friday, March 28, 2025 until 12 noon on Saturday, March 29, 2025. Every deanery in the Diocese will be offering 24 hours of continuous confessions. OLA is in the American River Deanery, and confessions for the American River Deanery will take place at St. Lawrence Parish in North Highlands. You may also go online and visit https://www.scd.org/Jubilee2025-24-Hours-for-the-Lord to look up the other 24 Hours for the Lord confession sites throughout the diocese.




