GOSPEL MEDITATION

2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy)

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do you get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.

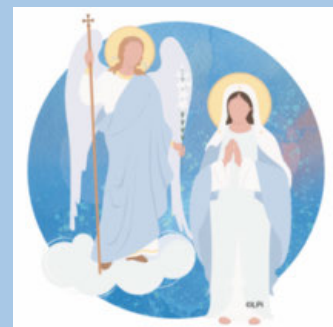

PARISH AND SCHOOL NEWS

Buildings and Grounds Update

The parish has a longstanding committee responsible for the maintenance of our buildings and grounds and for new ventures to improve our campus. Much goes on that is not always shared with the parish and we feel we have been remiss in not informing you, our parishioners, our most valuable resource.

One of our objectives in informing you of the various maintenance and new projects is to solicit your help. In presenting a project, we ask if you would be interested in helping fund a particular project. Any donation for a project would be used explicitly for that project.

Sometimes, we are asked to donate but are not sure where the money is going. This provides an opportunity to support the parish and know how the funds will be used.

SOLAR ENERGY: In late 2022, the Buildings and Grounds committee began looking at resuming solar electricity usage. The parish had installed solar panels on the roof of the church facility some 15 to 20 years ago. The original agreement included the parish using our solar power and selling surplus electricity to SMUD to mitigate the parish's energy costs. Although OLA is not currently selling electricity to SMUD, the agreement is still in effect and Buildings and Grounds is exploring enhancing our solar capability and resuming the SMUD agreement.

Our initial plan is to purchase an inverter, a device to convert the direct current (DC) electricity produced by our solar panels to alternating current (AC) electricity to be used by OLA and, also, to be sold to SMUD. The inverter will cost around \$5,000 but should allow us to begin using our solar panels again. The next step would be to look at individual panels and repair or purchase panels to gain full output of electricity.

We are, also, taking on a SMUD offer for a free energy assessment to help us mitigate our electricity costs. This will include assessing productiveness of our current solar panels and providing us with a plan to further decrease our usage and electrical demand beyond solar. The overall plan is to lessen our monthly costs.

SECURITY PATROL SERVICES: We have an intermittent problem with our homeless friends camping on the parish's grounds. In late January, Father Eduino hired a security service to provide on-site security from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am for one week to discourage folks from camping on our site. This was followed up with 3-times a night patrol services, every night through the end of February.

Over the next six months (through August) patrol services will randomly patrol the parish grounds 3-times a night. Randomly means no fixed days per week but averaging 3-time per week (some weeks may have 3, some 4, some 2, and not on a set schedule). We hope this will discourage homeless camping on the grounds and provide better security for users of our facilities.

We rejoice in celebrating last Saturday's Easter Vigil where Amy Lara, Brodie Shearer, Chad Worden, and Sara Hernandez were fully initiated into the Catholic Church, while David Cladianos and Kathleen Kerekes entered into Full Communion. The Mass was presided over by Father Eduino, with Father Brendan McKeefry concelebrating. Let's take a moment to introduce ourselves and offer our congratulations when we encounter them!

Holy Saturday commenced with a retreat of reflection and prayer for the RCIA Elect and Candidates. Meanwhile, many dedicated individuals worked tirelessly to beautify the church for the Easter Vigil. That evening, the music, led by Casey Oliver and performed by the Choir and instrumentalists, truly immersed us in the mystical experience of the Holy Spirit's presence. Lectors delivered their messages eloquently as messengers of Christ, and those who distributed the true presence of Christ in body and blood did so with utmost reverence. Four Altar Servers assisted, and the Knights of Columbus provided invaluable support throughout.

This remarkable evening was made possible by the commitment of the Elect and Candidates, the support of their Godparents/Sponsors and families, Father Eduino's guidance and leadership, Deacon Paul's oversight of the Liturgical Rites, Tim Flanigan's dedication as Lead Catechist, the catechetical contributions of Bill Simpson, Father Michael Hebda, Jordan Holmes, and Sharon Friedrich, and the prayers of our parishioners.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all involved, including Lori and Todd Allen, who worked tirelessly to ensure a meaningful RCIA process and Easter Vigil. May God bless each of you abundantly with His merciful love and grace this Easter Season!
