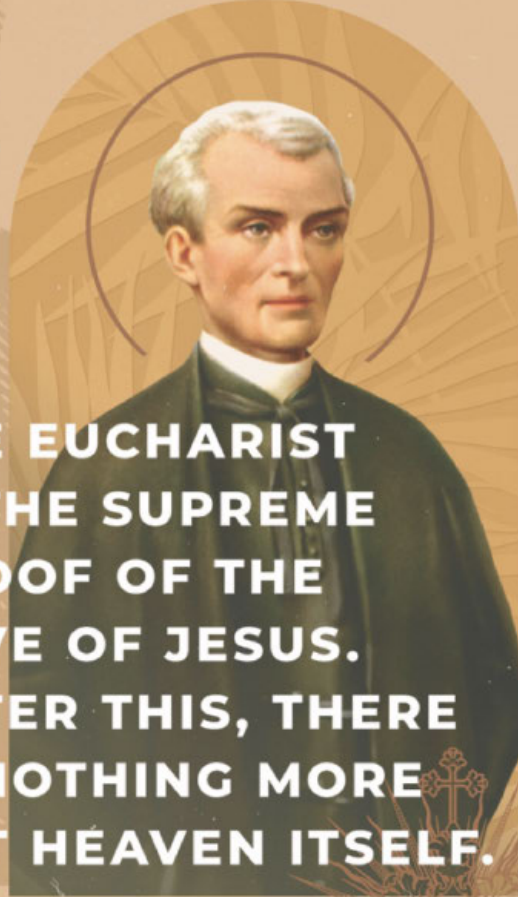

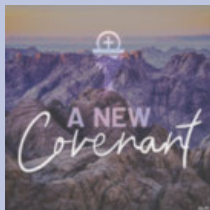
GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law for the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificial blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant. -Father John Muir ©LPI

PARISH AND SCHOOL NEWS

OLA Buildings and Grounds News May 2024

Read below for several important OLA parish and school buildings and grounds updates.

Solar Panels – We have purchased the inverter and are scheduling the installation and connection to the solar panels. We hope to be producing electricity this summer.

Refrigerator in St John's Hall – We purchased the refrigerator for St John's Hall. It was delivered on May 13th and operating. We received a donation to offset some of the cost.

Washer and Dryer – Our next purchase will be the washer and dryer over the summer. As noted earlier we will place it in Bannon Hall.

CalOES Grant

- Security Lighting – We are getting bids to replace and re-locate lights throughout the campus. The CalOES grant will cover \$5,000 each from the school and parish. The school and parish will split any balance over the \$10,000 in grant funding.
- Card Key Locks – We are on course to begin installation of our key card system over the summer. The school will be the priority so the key cards can be used when school starts in the fall. We are using the Brivo key card access system because it is already in use in Affinito Hall.
- PA System – The school is in the final stages of installing the PA system in the school for better communication in case of an emergency. We are using our current phone contractor, Quest (formerly Synectech).
- Security Fencing – We have submitted our plans to Sacramento County Planning and Metro Fire Department for limited, improved security coverage. This will primarily entail fencing off the areas around the rectory and St John's Hall to provide more safety for the rectory. We should have a better idea next month as to approvals and cost. If there are any saving on both sides for the grants, we are going to ask to apply them to other approved projects, e.g., card key locks, lighting, overage in ballistic film, and security cameras.
- Security Cameras – Not much has been mentioned about security cameras around the campus, but both the school and parish were \$15,000 each for security cameras. We made an initial walk through of the campus and will begin the process of bidding and installing the cameras.

This sacred experience reached its pinnacle with Midday Prayer led by Bishop Soto and adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament within St. John's church. Fruits of Holy Communion

Question: What are the "fruits" of holy Communion?

Answer: The Eucharist, like all sacraments, offers its own unique grace. We receive a special share in God's life that helps us in our faith journey. We are given all we need to sustain and nurture our relationship with God. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Everything we are and everything we hope to become is found in this sacrament. It is essential to the life of the church, to each member of the church. Without it, there is no church. The Eucharist is the center of our spiritual life and has enormous effects on our growth, our holiness, and our way of life.

The fruits of holy Communion are the benefits one receives from the sacrament. These fruits of holy Communion are discussed in the catechism in the article on the Eucharist. The primary benefit is union with Christ. We become one with him sacramentally, just as we hope to become one with him for eternity. The Eucharist also separates us from sin, both past and future. It forgives the venial sins of the past and, by the love we receive, protects us from mortal sin in the future. The church community is also unified and strengthened by the Eucharist. 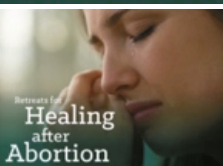


Weekly Meetings at OLA
