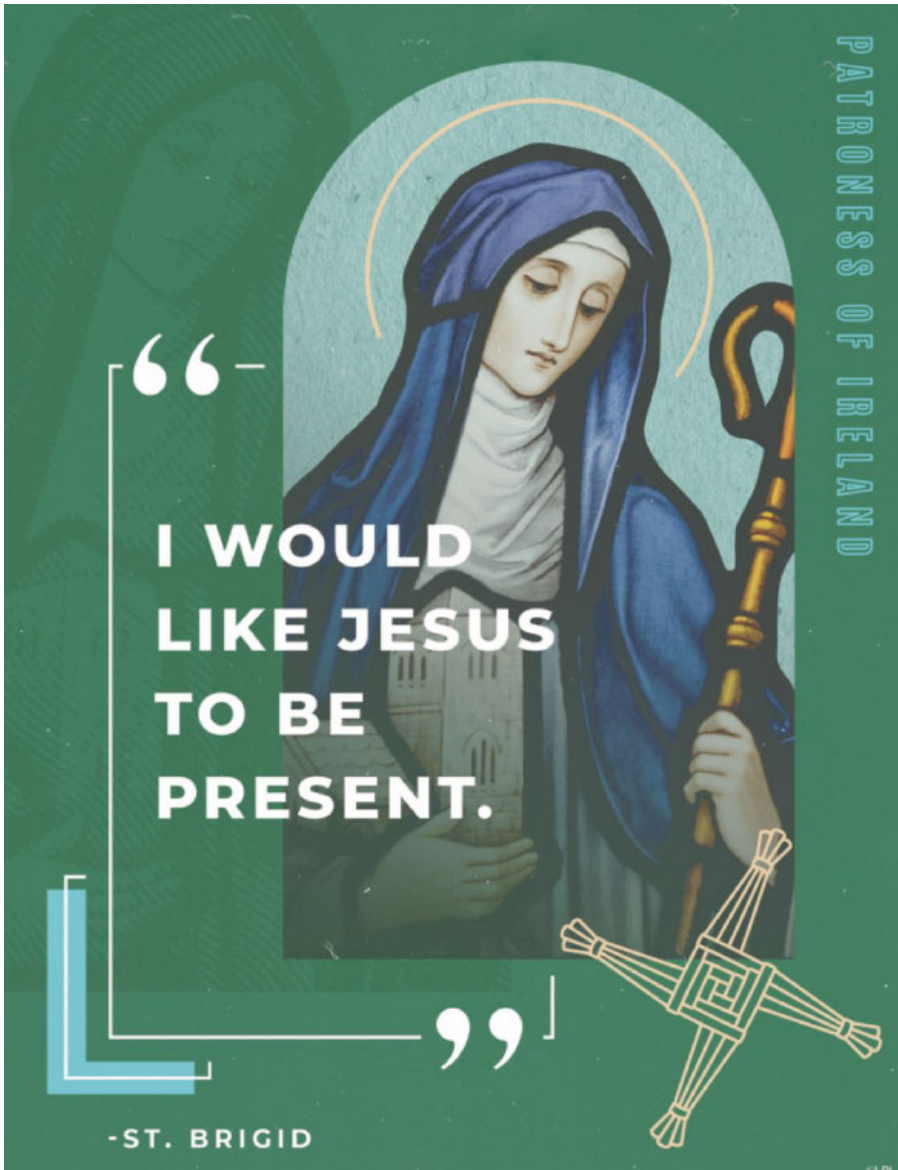

GOSPEL MEDITATION

June 30, 2024

Solemnity of the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament

Luke's story of Zacchaeus, the tax collector, is one of repentance and conversion. Moreover, it is also a reflection of Jesus' loving desire to save all of God's children, even the blatant sinner and the tax collector reviled by his fellow Jews for cheating them of their money and collaborating with their Roman overlords.

When Zacchaeus, a man of small stature, climbed a sycamore tree to see Jesus, the implication in the story is that he had a genuine spiritual longing for salvation. It is interesting to note that the sycamore tree was an important spiritual symbol in the ancient world of the eastern Mediterranean. It had various symbolic implications, particularly to the Jews, such as love, protection, and divinity. Thus, the climbing of the tree would symbolize his seeking a divine resolution of his sinfulness. Jesus recognized this and immediately invited himself to the tax collector's house. The lesson, of course, is that no matter how sinful we may be and out of step with the faithful, Jesus is always ready to answer our sincere plea for mercy and forgiveness. He will even invite us to his table.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "During his public life Jesus not only forgave sins, but also made plain the effect of this forgiveness: he reintegrated forgiven sinners into the community of the People of God for which sin had alienated or even excluded them. A remarkable sign of this is the fact that Jesus receives sinners at his table, a gesture that expresses in an astonishing way both God's forgiveness and the return to the bosom of the People of God." 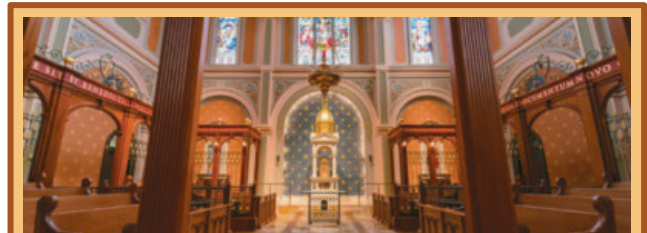

Catholic Q&A – Public Life

Question: *If we have a separation of church and state,
how should faith influence the way we act in society,
especially for those who have a role in the government?*

Answer: No matter who we are, our inner lives affect
the way we interact with the world. In the United States,
we have freedom of religion. That means there is no
official state-sanctioned religion. This does not mean
that our faith is a private affair with no impact on public
life! We can freely exercise our religious beliefs in
accord with our conscience. Not only do we have the
option to do so, but we also have the responsibility.
We're called to imitate Christ in every area of our life, not
compartmentalize our faith. This means acting with
respect and honoring the common humanity of all we
encounter. It means recognizing the person behind the
politics. It also means standing up for the truth of human
life and dignity, and advocating for just policies that
serve the common good. The Vatican has produced a
"Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church." It
contains more detailed exposition of how our Catholic
faith relates to various aspects of public life. ©LPI
