GOSPEL MEDITATION

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus asks us a stunning question this week: **“How can Satan cast out Satan?”** To enter into this question opens up the often-hidden dynamics of what Jesus has done and is constantly doing. If we’re honest, our response to some degree is: “How else can we cast him out? Satan is *precisely* how we cast out Satan!” But Jesus wants us to see this finally does not work. Here’s what I mean.

Satanas names the demonic mechanism by which we render wholeness through accusation. When we face a threat, we seek something to protect us (e.g., more money, social status, security, power, etc.). Rivals inevitably arise for these things and so do tensions. Accusation presents itself. “I’ll never be successful unless I get ahead of that guy.” “She’s already trying to get ahead of me.” “That group of immigrants is trying to take our jobs.” And so on. The accusation grows into a fear-inducing threat – things will break apart – no, they already are! Hurry! We inflict violence on the victim and – as if by magic – peace ensues. For a time. Soon fresh accusations are required to hold new chaos at bay, until there is no community left at all. This is essentially humankind’s sad history in a nutshell.

Jesus’ cross and resurrection unmasks this broken system of “casting out Satan by Satan” and ushers in a new one he calls “the Kingdom of God.” He reveals that the dynamic of accusation is nothing compared to his power of divine mercy and love. The cross (and not Satan) is the real power to tear down strongholds of sin and cast out Satan. This is why he describes himself as the **“stronger man who ties up the strong man to plunder his house.”** This week let’s notice the ways we **“cast out Satan by Satan,”** and then refuse to do it anymore. Because in the long run, that divided house cannot stand.

OLA SVdP Client Story of the Month

We are beginning a monthly series for the parish bulletin that will feature stories from the OLA Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. These stories will show the different kinds of assistance offered to clients within our parish boundaries.

May 2024 - A middle-aged truck driver called for rental assistance. Two motor accidents within a span of 7 months left him without income. The man told SVdP that he tried several agencies, churches, and even Carmichael HART (Homeless Action Response Team) as he was given an eviction notice. He was desperate and said he applied for SSI because doctors said he would be "disabled for life." Since he was self-employed, he did not have disability insurance.

Team 2 of OLA's SVdP called his landlord to verify what he owed. Per the landlord, this person was a good and responsible tenant for 10 years. The case was discussed further and determined to merit help. "Thank you," was all this person could say as he wept with emotion.

Through your gifts to the OLA Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, you fulfill Jesus' commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you."

Adoration at the River Recap



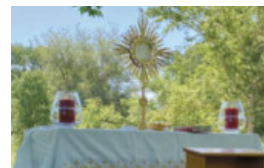
What a glorious First Saturday of June morning we spent at William B. Pond as part of the National Eucharistic Revival, gathering as the American River Deanery for a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration by the American River. Under the canopy of God's magnificent nature and amidst the whispers of His words, more than 80 participants experienced this poignant time of prayer, reflection, and music in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Feedback from our OLA family and others regarding this special time with Jesus was overwhelmingly enthusiastic. Our morning included fellowship with others in our deanery and we enjoyed delicious hot dogs sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council 4970 and other contributions.

The American River Deanery is one of twelve in the Diocese of Sacramento. According to Canon Law, bishops are given the authority to organize parishes into smaller geographical groups called "deaneries," which are overseen by a "dean" who assists the bishop in his administration of the diocese. The American River Deanery includes OLA and St. John the Evangelist in Carmichael; St. Mel in Fair Oaks; St. Lawrence in North Highlands; St. John Vianney in Rancho Cordova; and Our Lady of Lourdes, Presentation, St. Ignatius, St. Joseph, and St. Philomene in Sacramento.

Living the Word Scripture Study

All are welcome for the Living the Word Scripture Study on Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in Affinito Hall Meeting Room 3. We discuss the Sunday scripture readings and how they apply to our daily lives.

Catholic Q&A – God in Daily Life

Question: *How do I bring God into the work of my daily life?*

Answer: Whatever your daily work, you have an opportunity to encounter God and to follow His commandments in love. In the New Testament, we see that most of the Apostles didn't have a previous religious position. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. St. Paul was a tentmaker. Among the saints, we have doctors, lawyers, farmers, and stay-at-home moms. No matter your daily tasks, God can be present there!

One way concerns behavior. Start with an examination of conscience. Look at areas where you tend to struggle to imitate Christ at work. Do you gossip? Does brimming frustration become impatience at home? Pick one sin you struggle with, then choose a virtue to strengthen that area. If you tend to speak poorly of your co-workers, resolve to stop and to say one kind thing a day instead.

Another way relates to perspective, particularly your perspective of others. Jesus' incarnation reminds us of the value of every human being. Jesus is God, and each of us is created in God's image. When you encounter another person, you have an opportunity to see God in a new place and a new way – in that person in front of you. Genuinely listen to them and be present to their concerns. Loving your neighbor is loving God! Our relationship with God and the love He inspires in our hearts shouldn't remain only at church on Sunday. We can – and should – let our faith animate our lives! ©LPi

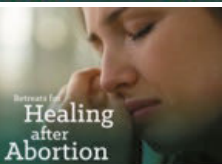


Weekly Meetings at OLA
