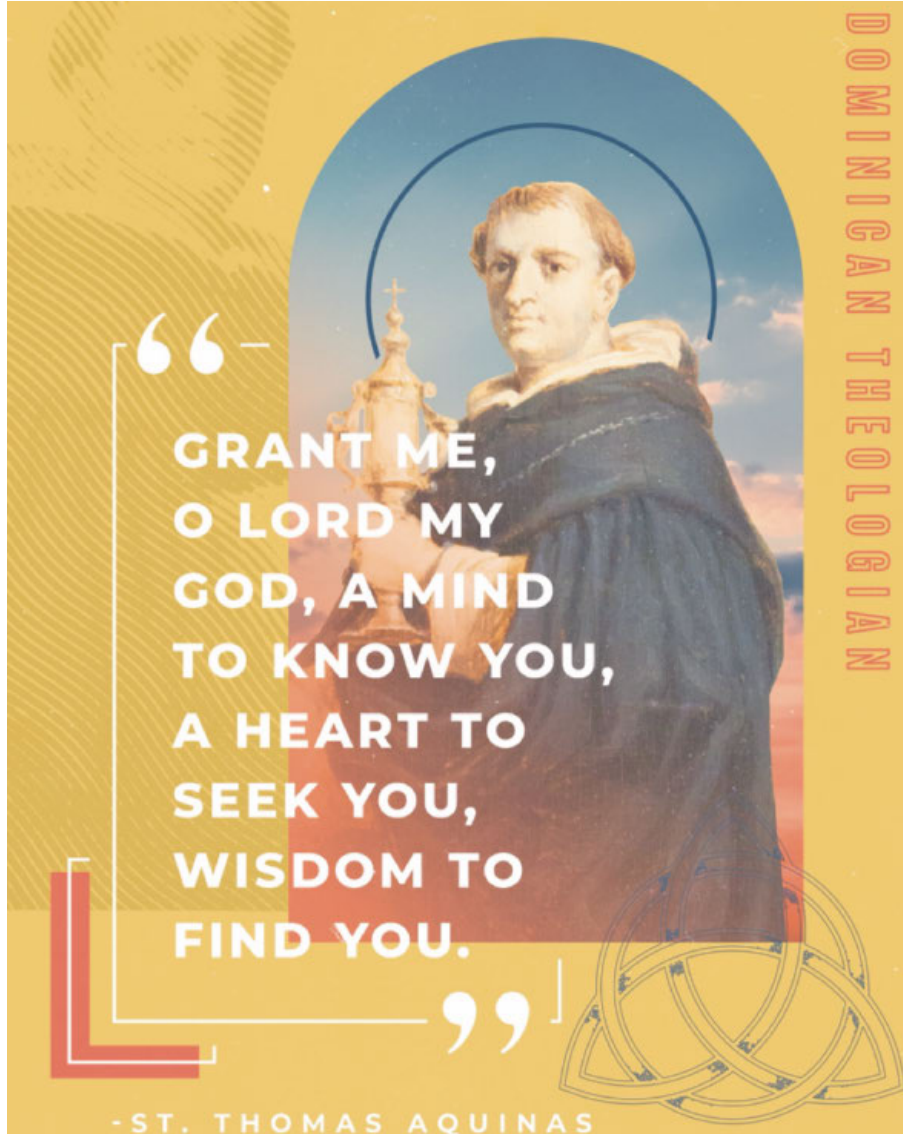

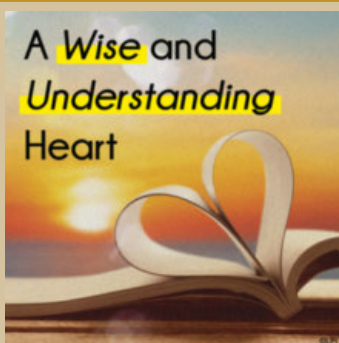
GOSPEL MEDITATION

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

Parish Volunteering and Fingerprinting Update

Firstly, thank you for your time and commitment to our parish. It is Diocesan policy that those who volunteer for the parish need to be fingerprinted and up to date on their Safe Haven training if working with youth in any capacity. Although we have made great strides so far, unfortunately we are still not 100% compliant.

Please contact the office immediately if:

1. You are a parish volunteer and have not had your fingerprints taken or you are not sure if you have.
2. You are a school parent and volunteer for the parish. The school and the parish are separate entities, so you may need to be fingerprinted in this case.
3. You have not completed or are not up-to-date on Safe Haven training.
4. You lead a ministry or committee.
5. You are unsure if this applies to you or have any questions.

I will be conducting two group Safe Haven Trainings and one LiveScan/Fingerprinting in September (date and time will be announced in an upcoming bulletin).

PLEASE NOTE: Volunteers not in compliance will no longer be eligible to serve as a parish volunteer.

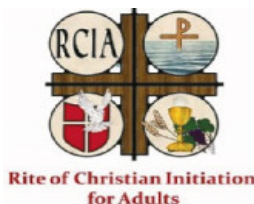

August RCIA Inquiry Information Sessions

Are you interested, or know someone who is interested, in learning more about our rich Catholic faith and possibly becoming Catholic? Did you know that a person is brought into full communion with the Catholic Church through the reception of the three sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist? This occurs through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). The RCIA is for those who have never been baptized, for those baptized in another faith, or for those baptized Catholic that have not completed the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist.

This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival by Bishop Robert Barron

God is calling us to the banquet! We are in the second year of the Eucharistic Revival. What's the purpose of the Eucharistic Revival? The Revival aims to inspire people to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. A Pew Forum Survey released in 2019 revealed a startling statistic that only one third of Catholics believe in transubstantiation, the Church's teaching that the Eucharist becomes the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ. In response to this shockingly low percentage of Catholic's belief in the Real Presence, Bishop Robert Barron wrote this book to help foster faith that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. This sacred meal, the Eucharist, is medicine for the soul. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1374, "...[T]he most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.'"

Even at the beginning, at Jesus' birth, God shows us Jesus is the Bread of Life and meant to be eaten. Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem, which in Hebrew translates to "House of Bread." The baby Jesus was placed in a manger – a place where animals eat. The word manger comes from the Latin word, mangiare, which means to chew. In John 6 when Jesus tells us to eat his flesh, the translated Greek word trógo from the Gospel also means to chew. Jesus was basically served to us on a plate (feeding trough), since Jesus is meant to be eaten.

At the Last Supper, the Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church his Spouse a memorial of his death and resurrection. As the Gospel of Matthew tells us: While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." (Mt 26:26-28; cf. Mk 14:22-24, Lk 22:17-20, 1 Cor 11:23-25)

This book by Bishop Barron combines biblical history, philosophy, scripture, significance of the Mass into one telling of God's great vision to share a meal in peace with all his people. Bishop Barron weaves these concepts masterfully into just 110 pages. While the book is short, each page packs a theological punch. I encourage you to pick up a copy of this book and read it. No matter where you are in your journey of faith, especially if you're curious or have questions about the Real Presence in the Eucharist. This book will have something for everyone to learn and grow in love and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.
