

Mass Intentions refer to the practice of offering a Mass for a specific purpose, such as for living or deceased **individuals.** The "†" means that a person is deceased.

The "(Sp)" means that it is a Special Intention for someone in need or an event like a birthday. The practice allows us to pray for others, both the living and the dead. This is a meaningful way for Catholics to express their faith and support for others through prayer.

A suggested donation in the province of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, which the Diocese of Sacramento is part, is \$10.00 but if a person cannot afford it there is no need for a donation.





August 10, 2025 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 12:49-53


During my baseball career, my best coach often said, "You shouldn't be worried if I yell at you. Be worried if I don't. If I stop pushing you, it means I don't think you have any more potential." He demanded a lot, and I knew it meant he saw that I could be something special on the baseball field.

Jesus says some demanding words to us this week. "Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth?" he asks, "No, tell you but rather division" (Luke 12:51). He wants you and me-in fact, all the earth-to participate in the luminous glory of God. That's why he speaks of himself as a divine arsonist. Divine fire is like a good coach: it demands the removal of all that obstructs the achievement of the lofty goal.

How is your life demanding right now? That inconvenient family situation, the unfair boss at work, the kids who reject their parents' wishes, the nagging health issue? Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. But for us who believe in the one who comes to set the earth of fire, we should be much more worried if he stops demanding so much from us. In fact, let's thank him for it. He sees how glorious we can become.








LIVING THE WORD SCRIPTURE STUDY

CATHOLIC Q & A WHY REGISTER AT YOUR PARISH

<u>Question</u>: Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer: Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

Leeana is due in December. Prayers for a healthy and safe pregnancy are appreciated.



JUBILEE YEAR - PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Bishop Soto's third Jubilee theme is probably the most difficult of them all: "We groan in hope with all creation for God's redemption." Indeed, the groaning of the world is ever more apparent. Missiles have flown between Tel Aviv and Teheran; the churches in Lebanon, Syria, and Africa are producing martyrs; and civil unrest in our own nation makes this global anxiety felt even more at home. As Bishop Soto reminds us, in this life, "we are not exempt from pain and suffering." However, "in this suffering, we express our longing and desire and trust in God's love and promises."

Christ himself groaned to Father with "loud cries and tears" during his Passion, and "he was heard because of his reverent submission" (Heb 5:7). His invocation of Psalm 22 on the Cross is not, therefore, a statement of utter despair ("My God, my God, why have you forsaken me"), but remains an expression of invincible hope in God's saving power. "All the ends of the earth shall remember," the Psalmist continues, "and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him." From Calvary, Christ already points to the recapitulation of all creation to God. - Joey Belleza, Ph.D.
