GOSPEL MEDITATION


21th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them qo.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either.

A Journey - Mary, Statue of the Assumption

You might have noticed last weekend that our statues, Mary being assumed into heaven and St. Joseph carrying the infant Jesus, have returned and are mounted by the main entrances. They have returned – reconditioned. Mary once resided prominently in our old church, now Bannon Hall, when we first began as a parish. She was adoringly carved out of wood. And there she resided until we built the church we currently use with its new art and statues. Mary's new home was the chapel, where her paint faded away over the long years, along with our memory – "impossible to forget but hard to remember."

But fate would call; so, she began a journey. Now, we take some time to describe various events to fill out the story: A discussion with Father – "I would like to clean up the back of the church so our main entrance is not so cluttered. We need to get rid of the tables and the paper clutter. We need to make it more appealing, more welcoming." "What if we moved the statue of Mary – the Assumption from the chapel." "Let's do it."

A discussion at our school – "The students would like to donate to the church, how about a statue?" "That would be good. Maybe a statue of Joseph. We are moving a statue of Mary from the chapel. Could you measure it, then get a statue of Joseph that would match in size?"

So, we moved Mary, the school donated the statue of Joseph holding the infant Jesus, and we put up lights to highlight them. Enter Dana Whalen. She and her husband have been parishioners at OLA since their daughters attended our school, years ago. She had restored other statues and felt called to restore Mary to her wonder. So, she invited Mary into their home and found a portrayal of Mary by Bartolomé Esteban Murillo. His colors were vibrant, beautiful, and she decided to use his colors, using the same tones to bring Mary back to life. She also took Joseph to match the skin tones and other details with Mary. They began their sojourn in May and completed it on the Feast of Our Lady of the Assumption.

Now our little Holy Family has returned. Thank you to all involved, and welcome back!

Did you know that a person is brought into full communion with the Catholic Church through the reception of the three sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist? This occurs through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults - OCIA (formerly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults - RCIA). The OCIA is for those who have never been baptized, those who have been baptized in another faith, or those who have been baptized Catholic and have not completed the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. If you are over the age of 16 and interested, inquiries will be held on the following Wednesdays: 8/28, 9/4, and 9/11. Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
