


This year, the First Eucharist Masses are taking place during the weekend of the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament.

Priest/Deacon: Christ have mercy. Christ have mercy.



Profession of Faith (Nicene Creed)

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.





Priest: *Deliver us, Lord ... the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ.*


For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever.
